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## OW TEE VMEY

As you read this, the Moneycard Collector Catalog has been out for about five weeks. As I write this, the first catalogs have been in collectors' hands about a week, far too early to get an in-depth reaction, but long enough to get a first impression.
To put it mildly, we're floored by the enthusiasm we've seen and heard since Publisher Murray Church and Advertising Manager Tim Yedinak unveiled the 872-page, full-color behemoth at TeleCard World East '97. Will the catalog be the purple-clad juggernaut that helps take the hobby to the next level? We hope so. While we catch our breaths, it is easy to see
 the catalog's debut as an ending. More accurately, it is a beginning.

One long-time industry veteran, a former executive at one of major card issuers and now a consultant, says flatly, "I've seen many catalogs done for many different hobbies and this is by far the best ever."

Is it perfect? No, of course not. The catalog is a moment frozen in time, a snapshot of a growing hobby. Is it better than any North American catalog that has gone before? Yes, by a long shot.

Of course there are mistakes. Human beings working on tight deadlines have yet to produce a written work that hasn't contained mistakes. We want you, our readers, to offer changes and corrections. Some will be considered and then set aside as valid differences of opinion. But many will be embraced and incorporated in our second edition.

How long will you have to wait for the second edition? Collectors will help us decide that To find Moneycard Collector at a book store or newsstand near you, please call 1-800-221-3148. by participating in the interactive survey accessed through the Cable \& Wireless card included in the first 3,000 copies of the catalog and by filling in and returning the written survey in the back of the catalog. We encourage readers to help launch the second edition by ordering their firstedition catalogs now and answering the surveys, as well as by mailing proposed changes to Editor, Moneycard Collector, Box 783, Sidney, Ohio 45365.

Whither goest the collectibility of NYNEX cards? The long-awaited refund program for NYNEX Change Cards, both the optical Landis \& Gyr cards and the magnetic Tamura cards, has been announced. NYNEX, now Bell Atlantic, has taken the extra, appreciated step of releasing quantities of cards and has pledged to destroy all returned cards. The refund program runs through Jan. 31, 1998, so it should be an interesting couple of months while collectors and dealers weigh what they should keep and what they will return.

Have you ever vaguely remembered a past article or feature story that you would like to revisit, but don't want to leaf through more than three years' worth of Moneycard Collector to find? Are you a more recent subscriber who wants to know what has gone before? A good starting point might be our first Editorial Index, found on Pages 29-30. Readers should be able to use it to find in what edition stories, listed alphabetically by topic, appeared. We hope you find it a valuable tool. Look for a yearly update every December.

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## FIRE HITS JR'S

0ne of the gentlemen of the phonecard industry is fighting to recover from a September fire that destroyed most of his card inventory.
"I don't think I will come back as a full-time dealer," says Jack Ritchie, owner of JR's Telecards of Aiken, S.C. Heat from the Sept. 13 fire melted an estimated 75 percent of his 7,000 -card inventory. The cards were not insured.

Ritchie, whose phonecard business was based at his residence, was awakened at 4 a.m. by a smoke alarm. Dense clouds of black smoke filled the home, and Ritchie and his wife escaped through the window of a spare bedroom. The buildup of lint from a clothes dryer vent ignited, causing a fire in the home's utility room. The fire spread to the kitchen, and heat from the fire reached the adjoining phonecard office.

The loss from destroyed and damaged phonecards, stamps, coins, limited art prints and furnishings is estimated at $\$ 130,000$, Ritchie said in early 0 ctober.
"I would like to commend my customers and dealers who have been tremendously helpful," Ritchie said from the townhouse he is renting while his home is being renovated.
"I am thankful I survived.
Ritchie, reminiscing about the phonecard hobby, says his reduced role doesn't mean he is abandoning the hobby. He says he always is willing to give advice to collectors.
"This will be a tremendous business, I really believe that," he says. "It has great potential and will be the wave of the future." Ritchie says that he always has been an avid collector and will continue to be. He says that Moneycard Collector started him off in the phonecard field. "I read your first issue and was hooked," he says. "I still have it - or I did ... the fire got it."

"We need to educate young people to the hobby," he says. "The thrill in collecting is not investment, we're not dealing with the stock market here, we're dealing with a hobby." I've had so many people say "Is this going to go up in price? - the thrill is finding something new. I want this to be fun."

Ritchie advocates that collectors find a theme and then explore it. His personal favorites are wildlife, Cable \& Wireless issues and AT\&T Teletickets.
"I have made so many new friends worldwide who are avid collectors. They are inspirations to me," he says. "Some small collectors have the biggest hearts in the world." One found out about his fire and sent him a half-dozen T-shirts. Another enclosed two 60 -minute phonecards for him to use. "These are priceless things, I wouldn't sell them for a thousand bucks," Ritchie says.

He hopes to join with some other small dealers and schedule an auction with each dealer's proceeds split evenly between the dealer and charities. Ritchie's choices are for a children's charity and perhaps an environmental foundation. Ritchie plans to schedule the auction for around the first of December and hopes to create a special phonecard for the auction if he can get permission from Coca-Cola.. He hopes to enlist the aid of Alan Cohen and The Card Mall in trying to schedule a mail bid that will coincide with an Internet bid.

Ritchie plans to auction the estimated $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 15,000$ worth of phonecards in his personal collection - they were stored separately in a bank vault - plus cards that he can salvage from his dealer stock. He says he will not sell damaged cards, and will be able to announce what has been destroyed when he acquires a new computer. The hard drive on his previous computer was lost in the fire, but he has backup copies of his inventory on floppy disks that were not damaged.

Those plans are a far cry from the dispirited man who had to be hospitalized three separate times a few weeks ago. Being treated for smoke inhalation, he kept trying to leave before he was fully recovered, and found himself back in the hospital.
"In the hospital, I was at a point where I had said, 'The hell with it all.' I was sick, I was discouraged. That letter of yours gave me inspiration that you would not believe." In the letter, Moneycard Collector Publisher Murray Church, Editor Tom Williams and Advertising Manager Tim Yedinak had offered Ritchie editorial and advertising support to get back on his feet.
"I'm getting my fighting spirit back," he says. "I have my life, I have my wife, I have my friends." What more could anyone ask for?

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# THEMO <br>  <br> When it comes to moneycard information THE BETIER

Now that the Moneycard Collector Catalog is out, you probably think you have the perfect reference guide. Well, if you only consider the U.S. and Canada, you are probably right. But, what about the rest of the world? And, should you throw out your old U.S. catalogs?

There are enough worldwide phonecard catalogs to, well, fill a catalog. What follows is a glimpse at a selection of them, plus a few comments on some older U.S. catalogs. Some others that are not mentioned here were covered in the June 1997 issue of Moneycard Collector two French and two German catalogs, including a German Coca-Cola card catalog.

Going through catalogs, even old ones, is fun. In many cases, it will be the closest any of us get to owning some of the classic early phonecards. Without a catalog, for example, how could you tell which one of the 56 varieties of Danish parrot phonecards that you have in your collection?

Japan probably issues the most phonecards of any country in the world. For a number of reasons, there is only one major Japanese phonecard catalog. Sirius, a German publisher, produced Helmut Treude's PhonecardGuidebook Japan, in 1994. While the cards listed only go to around the middle of 1987, 10 years ago, the information is both timeless, and priceless, to anyone who has more than a handful of Japanese phonecards in their collection. More than 670 pages of background information, full color illustrations, and checklists fill this catalog. All the information is provided in both English German.

Reasons why no other comprehensive catalogs exist are simple. Japan has issued at least two billion phonecards since 1984. The number of different designs runs in to the millions. Except for national designs, also known as counter cards, small press runs are the norm.

Further, Japan is divided into 11 phonecard issuing regions. Sometimes the same design is used in more than one region. Frequently, cards are reprinted. White and free cards are available for anyone to have printed with their own message, advertising, or design. Stock design cards, called model cards, can have special messages overprinted on hundreds of different standard backgrounds.

In addition, a customer can go into a large NTT office and get a custom computer-printed card made right on the spot. Realistically, who could possibly keep track of all these cards? The best you can hope for is to identify who issued the card, what type of card it is, when it was issued, and the region where it was issued. The Sirius catalog will help you do just that.

The Sirius catalog was produced when Nippon Telephone and Telegraph (NTT) was the only provider of domestic telephone service in Japan. Prior to that, the government-owned phone company was popularly known by its nickname, DenDenKoSha. Because NTT's phonecards were in use when the catalog was written, DenDenKoSha phonecards are also known as precursors, or pre-NTT cards. The incredible detail provided about DenDenKoSha cards is worth the price alone.

Most phonecard collectors eventually migrate into collecting themes, or topics. Germans use the term "motiv." The Sirius catalog is broken down into several motiv sections. Want to know when the first Coca-Cola phonecard was issued? The first Disney?

Here are a few quick facts about Japanese phonecards issued after the Sirius catalog was published. The catalog mentions that high denomination phonecards weren't issued after 1986, because of fraud. It turned out to be relatively easy for crooks to reload used cards, or to change denominations. Since then, fraud became so rampant that NTT phonecards were
eventually declared invalid for international use.
Supposedly, the main users of fake phonecards were foreign "guest" workers, phoning home. Japan is now converting to a reloadable inductive phonecard. While this should cut down on fraud, the result will be a dramatic decrease in the number of used phonecards cards available. One of the long distance companies, KDD, began issuing chip phonecards a few years ago.

Steve Eyer Phonecards sells the Sirius catalog for $\$ 57.50$ postpaid. The postpaid part is nice, as the catalog weighs over two pounds. You can also buy it from Telequest. Sirius recently published a worldwide CocaCola phonecard catalog.

Another country that issues a huge quantity of phonecards is Italy. Three recent catalogs from this country include Carte Telefoniche Italiane, 5th edition 1997, by L. Cacace and M. Cecconi, and published by C\&C. This is a specialized Italian catalog, also covering the Vatican, San Marino, and other countries using the Urmet system. The Italian company Urmet is a leading provider of phonecards and public phones. Urmet phonecards are distinguished by having to tear off a corner of the phonecard before it is accepted by the payphone. Introductory and key material, in this full-color catalog, are in several languages, including English.

Urmet provides payphone systems to over 25 countries, and more than 20 of them use Urmet phonecards. R. Mourglia is the author the 1997 edition of Urmet Telephone Cards, published by C\&C. Want some facts and figures? Urmet has been in the telephone industry for more than 35 years. Close to half a million card payphones have been delivered, along with more than a billion of their magnetic-stripe phonecards. 40,000 cardphones were produced by Poland alone, under license. And so on. This is a full-color catalog, with over 70 pages.

Yet another C\&C catalog is Start Schede Telefoniche Italiane e Mondiali, 1997 edition. Anyone surviving a semester of high school Italian recognizes the word "mondial" as meaning worldwide. So, along with extensive full-color information about Italian, Vatican, and San Marino phonecards, the catalog has more than 85 pages of international phonecard information. These pages will help you identify those mystery phonecards.

C\&C Publishers can be contacted at C.so Lione 36, 10141 Torino, Italy. The Italian specialized catalog sells for about $\$ 23$, the Urmet catalog is about $\$ 10$, and the Italian \& Worldwide catalog/guide is also about $\$ 10$. Of course, postage must be added to these figures. Air mail is expensive, and sea mail is slow.

Another recent catalog is the 1997 Catalogo Especializado España Y Andorra Tarjetas Telefonicas, which lists and pictures cards issued in Spain and the Principality of Andorra since 1981. The four-color catalog, which includes descriptions of the various chips used in those phonecards, sells for $\$ 20$ plus shipping and handling, from the Associacio per al Colleccionisme de Targetes Telefoniques, Tres Torres 14, Granollers, Spain 08400.


If you are looking for a current worldwide phonecard catalog, you will probably be disappointed. It would be the size of a New York City telephone directory, if it existed at all. For worldwide information, what you will find are an extensive guide to the earliest cards. The latter is the Italian catalog with the "mondial" section, mentioned above.

The earliest worldwide phonecards were cataloged by S.E.R. Hiscocks in 1990, and published by Stanley Gibbons. There is an English language edition, currently selling for $\$ 50$, and a French edition, currently selling for $\$ 30$. The French edition, Guide Mondial de Cartes-Telephone, is usually sufficient for all but the most specialized information. It's up to you if you want to spend the extra $\$ 20$ for English. The information on early phonecards from France \& Belgium is extensive, while that of Great Britain is minimal (mostly because there is a
 separate Hiscocks GB catalog, plus any number of others). Both are available from Steve Eyer.

One of the other catalogs detailing cards of Great Britain is The Standard Catalogue of UK Telephone Cards, printed by the Telephone Card Catalogue Company. The book is in loose-leaf format in a ring binder, so supplements can be added or issuers of little interest to the collector set aside. The "Standard Catalogue" lists more than 2,000 British cards, with many four-color pictures.

You probably noticed by now that the new Moneycard Collector Catalog includes other prepaid cards, besides phonecards. Interestingly enough, some of the catalogs discussed above include samples of various moneycards, too. For example, the Sirius Japan catalog has a six-page section showing examples of other Japanese prepaid cards, like McDonald's U-Cards, JNR/JR Orange Cards (used to buy train tickets), highway cards (used on toll roads), metro/subway/bus/streetcar/ monorail cards,
postage cards (beating the USPS Liberty Cash cards by seven years), video arcade cards, racetrack cards, golf driving range cards, department store cards, $7-11$ cards, and so on. The Urmet catalog has a section on cards used as tickets on the Italian Railways, newspaper cards, cash cards, chip cards, vending machine cards, and so on.

Collecting Visa Cards has now become popular, worldwide. You'll find the U.S, and Canadian cards in the Moneycard Collector Catalog. Did you know that the precursors to Visa Cash are the Danmont cards, from Denmark? The same technology developed by Danmont was used by Visa Cash (Visa bought the company). In fact, you can read Danmont cards in a Visa Cash viewer. Some Danish phonecard catalogs list Danmont cards. One example is the Katalog Over Danske Telekort, 1995 edition, which then sold for under $\$ 10$, plus postage. It is an A4 size, using GBC binding. Besides listing all Danish phonecards, by the six phone companies, which frequently issued the same designs, the catalog also lists the Danmont cards. You should be able to obtain the latest edition of this catalog from Fyns Frimærke Service, Norregade 37, 1.sal, Postboks 1135, 5100 Odense C, Denmark.

A worldwide Visa Cash catalog was published by the author last January, along with a supplement, in August. More than 260 Visa Cash cards are listed, from 20 banks, in seven countries. Most are illustrated, both obverse and reverse. There are over 60 pages, in black and white. The pages are not bound, so that the collector can sort them in any way desirable. For example, collectors in Australia probably want the cards from their country to be the first ones they look at, whereas collectors in Italy probably want their cards listed first.

The catalog also includes other money cards, such as the USPS Postal Buddy cards, and Liberty Cash. Ten pages of "back of the book" cards are included, to help collectors in identifying them. The catalog sells for $\$ 20$ postpaid in the U.S., and $\$ 25$ elsewhere.


Further catalog updates are available in the forum of a newsletter. See the ad in the classified section, under Books and Literature For Sale.

Now, let's get to some of the older U.S. phonecard catalogs. Should you keep them, now that the new Moneycard Collector Catalog is out? You bet. For one thing, you can never have too much information. Every cataloguer presents the material in a different way. While newer catalogs can help clear up questions you might have about items in older catalogs, the reverse can be true, as well. The first edition of Hiscocks and Garibaldi's North American, Caribbean and Atlantic phonecard catalog was also the last one to include cards outside the U.S. and Canada. That means that if you throw away the old catalogs, you also discard virtually the only available information on phonecards from our other closest neighboring countries.

Taking Mexico as an example, both telephone companies, Telmex and Telnor, continue to issue great collectible chip phonecards, all having wonderful and colorful designs. However, cards issued after 1993 or 1994 aren't in the second edition of the H\&G catalog. Speaking of the second edition of the H\&G catalog, the inside joke is that the rarest ones are the copies not personally autographed by the authors.

Incidentally, if you are interested in collecting Mexican phonecards, there is a collector group in Mexico City, working on a catalog. A free catalog of Telnor cards from Mexico, including phonecards from Costa Rica, is available from the author, by sending a No. 10 envelope with 55 cents postage, or three used phonecards. Again, the address is in the classified ad section.

Another early U.S. catalog is Hofmeister's TKK U.S. catalog, with both English and German text. It was produced, in Germany, in September 1994. It was an attempt at a comprehensive U.S. catalog where none had existed before. However, it was quickly overshadowed by the $\mathrm{H} \& \mathrm{G}$ catalog. It also suffered from understandable errors and omissions, demonstrating the extreme difficulty of attempting to produce a catalog of cards from a country thousands of miles away. Though it claimed to cover North America, there wasn't any Canadian or Mexican information. If you come across this catalog, a dollar or two would be a reasonable amount to offer.

Finally, don't discount the usefulness of dealer's price lists as catalogs. Just remember to be considerate. Always enclose a dollar, or postage, unless the dealer instructs otherwise. When doing research, the author consults old pricelists almost as frequently as old catalogs.

To reiterate, you can never have too much information. All catalogs complement each other. Save your old ones, as long as you have the room. Your best bet is to get the newest and most comprehensive catalog available, and then see what else you can find, as well. There are dozens of foreign and specialty catalogs available. Chances are, if you collect it, there's a catalog.

## Ameritech

While there will be more Ameritech information and illustrations in the upcoming months, here is a bit of what the company has been up to. Phonecards featuring the Chicago White Sox continue to be produced. There were 15,000 cards distributed at three recent games at Comiskey Park. The latest three cards, one given out at each game, feature historic White Sox uniforms. There's also a Halloween card planned for this year. A small quantity of cards was produced to commemorate the National Black NBA. Another card was made for the Puerto Rico Festival in Chicago. Two more cards, in 60 - and 120 -minute denominations, were issued for the Retail Vision trade show in San Diego.

## Bell Allantic/NYNEX

Everyone knows by now that NYNEX has stopped producing Change Cards. The company, now merged with Bell Atlantic, also has stopped producing remote-memory cards in anticipation of Bell Atlantic reintroducing prepaid cards under that name. For further discussion on these changes and collectibility, please see the NYNEX update in this month's "Quik Takes," Page 40.

## Pacific Bell

Because of the other big merger, that of Pacific Telesis into Southwestern Bell (SBC), PacBell also is not currently issuing phonecards. Previously issued phonecards, of course, continue to work. SBC has pretty much allowed its own collectible phonecard program to wither. So, what will become of the popular PacBell phonecards? Some of those earliest cards are among America's most sought-after. Further, what will happen to Nevada Bell's phonecard plans? And how will all of this affect SBC's older phonecards? Only time will tell. The similarities and differences between the new Bell Atlantic and the new SBC should stir plenty of debate.

## US WEST

Big news comes in the form of an upcoming 15-card collector set. The set will come in an attractive folder. It will have the theme "Life's Better Here." 1,500 sets will be produced, and initially offered for sale to the company's 60,000 employees. Remaining sets will be sold to collectors exclusively through the company's two distributors, USACard and KARS. Each set will have $14 \$ 5$ cards, and a single $\$ 15$ card. The number 14 was chosen since there are that number of states in U S WEST's service area. To ensure uniformity, the same artist will produce each of the 14 designs. Incidentally, the $\$ 15$ denomination is a first and expected to be the last for U S WEST. Look for illustrations in an upcoming edition.

Talk about growth! U S WEST is going about it in a big way. First there's growth exhibited by plenty of new and great collectible chip phonecards. Then there's growth by
becoming a founding member of the Global Chipcard Alliance (see below). The latter means that U S WEST
phonecards are already interchangeable with those of GTE, including Hawaiian Telephone, GTE chip phonecards in general, and those of Bell Canada. That's both vertical and horizontal growth, and great news for collectors, as well as consumers. Speaking of new phonecards, here are a few issued since the last "Baby Bell Notes," that weren't mentioned in "New Issues."


U S WEST; Nortel Payphone complimentary; \$1 denomination; 50,000 issued; August 1997.


U S WEST; Minnesota State Fair; $\$ 5$ denomination; 3,000 issued; August 1997.

Complimentary cards are always sought-after by collectors, and U S WEST has issued several of these \$1 phonecards. The latest one features both the Nortel Millennium payphone, and U S WEST's new phonecard slogan, "Changing the Shape of Money." The 50,000 payphone complimentary cards replace the falling coins design. The way to ensure obtaining U S WEST complimentary cards is to have a standing order with the company's two distributors.

Commemorating local events within its operating area is a U S WEST tradition. Again this year, a phonecard was produced for the Minnesota State Fair. 3,000 of this $\$ 5$ card were on sale at the fairgrounds. As always, the cards are also available from the official distributors.

## Global Chipcard Alliance

There are now 16 members of the Global Chipcard Alliance (GCA). U S WEST is one of the founding members of the GCA, which was formed in October 1996. Other first members were PTT Telecom (Holland), GTE (U.S.), Bell Canada, and Telekom Malaysia. The GCA was formed to develop a global environment for multi-functional smartcards with common standards and specifications.

Additional GCA members are Deutsche Telekom, American Express and Oracle. The newest eight members, who joined in mid-September, are IBM, Microsoft, Telstra (Australia), Gemplus (France), Landis \& Gyr (Switzerland), Nortel (Canada), SPT Telecom (Czech Republic) and Elcotel (Florida). Customers of GTE (including Hawaiian Telephone), U S WEST, and Bell Canada, can use their chipcards interchangeably in Nortel's Millennium phones. These phones are also in use by other companies in the USA, including Nevada Bell and Bell South. The latter's payphones accept Visa Cash chipcards in the Atlanta area.

There's something special about cards that become desired collectibles as opposed to those produced specifically for the collectors, and the older the better. Let's get to the new cards:


BIG BOY. Telenova; 6 minutes; 760 issued, August 1997. This chains franchises have many names. It all began in Cincinnati as Frisch's Big Boy. Shoney's and Elias Brothers are also familiar "Big Boys" antecedents. This card is for Bob's Big Boy. Other names precede Big Boy, varying all over the country.


SEAFAIR AIR SHOW. U S WEST; \$1 denomination; 10,000 issued, August 1997. The Blue Angels attack the U S WEST chip for the SeaFair Air Show held earlier this year. A successful outing for our dedicated U.S. Armed Forces, and a great image for a phonecard.

MARILYN IN MOTION. Karis Communications; \$5, \$7, and $\$ 10$ denomination; 2,500 issued, September 1997. These three lenticular cards have frames of successive pictures laid onto the surface of the card. So Marilyn really does move, like a very short movie. Included is the skirt scene, in motion, from the famous "The 7Year's Itch" movie. I predict this will become even more popular.

## 125 YEARS OF

 TELECOMMUNICATION. Cable \& Wireless; \$15 denomination; 11,000 issued, July 1997. Cable \& Wireless' entry into the hallowed halls of most popular is no surprise given the innovative team in Virginia. What coordination it must have taken to convince five separate divisions to simultaneously produce a telecard. No one could do better. MOUNTAIN DEW. Karis Communications; 10 minutes; 500 issued, July 1997. After some delay the Mountain Dew card appeared, but caused a fraction of the excitement of its predecessor, the pull-tab Pepsi. Nonetheless, the card sold out. You gotta Dew what you gotta Dew.


MAKING THE WORLD SWEETER. Image Telecom; 15 minutes; 1,997 issued, August 1997. There also are 150 jumbo versions with 15 minutes of time. Sweet tooths can't find a better treat than the jumbo version but if this doesn't suit you, the regular card is more affordable.


MCDONALD'S HAPPY MEAL DIE CUT. Score Board; set/3 \$25 denomination each; 856 issued, May 1996. These die cuts seem to be perennially popular. They've visited AMW before and are scarce. I like them, but they may be a little too pricey for a beginning collector.

## MILLENNIUM PHONE. U S WEST; $\$ 1$

 denomination; 50,000 issued, August 1997. Complimentary card introducing the Millennium Cardphone to the Northwest. Northern Telecom must be grinning ear-toear. Both U S WEST and GTE are rapidly installing NT Millennium Cardphones throughout the country. 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## Words on numbers

Revisiting＂Hot Cards

＂Hot Cards＂was introduced to readers in our June 1997 issue of Moneycard Collector．This sec－ tion was created to show the most heavily sold and traded cards within the last month． Readers might notice the prices reflected in this section are dealer asking／selling prices for only that month．

As in any other retail business，compa－ nies run sales and special prices．Card prices go up and down with customer demand．Quantity also plays an important role in card pricing．Perhaps after the card is no longer in＂Hot Cards，＂it could，in fact，become more valuable as dealers might be sold out and the card becomes harder to find．

If you find a conflicting price in the Price Guide when comparing it to＂Hot Cards，＂bear in mind that the only prices looked at for＂Hot Cards＂are just the prices submitted for that month and only from those dealers who participate．If one company lists a hot price for a particular card that no other dealer mentioned，then that price is used．If several dealers give prices on the same card，then just those prices are considered for setting that month＇s price．

The Price Guide is looking at a much larger picture．Many dealer price lists are utilized and changes are made with more discretion．There is a third source that could also list a different price－the new Moneycard Collector Catalog．These cata－ log prices were set keeping in mind the ups and downs of cards over a longer period and where they are most likely to even out．

If this seems like a lot of prices to think about，you＇re right．But isn＇t it better to have several different sources to refer to when purchasing a card？No one can be sure what a card will be worth down the road，so my advice is collect what you like， what you think is a hot card，check out where you can get the best price and buy！

We are in the process of putting all the proofreading corrections from the catalog into our computer to reconcile this docu－ ment with the actual catalog．Once this is done all new cards that are received will be given their Moneycard Collector Number （MCN）as soon as we get them．Whenever they appear in the magazine，this number will be included with the card information． Our goal is to have this system implemented over the next several months．

ש'e've got corporate cards for everything this month including health needs, computer needs and snacks so let's get right to it.

Express continues its production of eye-catching die-cut promotional cards with a 10 -minute card in the shape of a bottle of Cetaphil cleanser and moisturizer. There were 25,000 of these bottle-shaped cards issued and distributed nationwide to nurses working for dermatologists across the country. A great card - if you're lucky enough to know a dermatologist's nurse who has one!

Also from Phonecard Express this month is a card promoting the computer program pcANYWHERE. Each card has 30 minutes of time and was produced for a two tier promotion. The first tier involved 5,000 cards which went to Best Buy stores to use as a thank you to customers purchasing pcANYWHERE. The second tier involved 2,000 cards issued to independent sales reps for selling the software.

DeltaCom recently issued a card for Corning. The recruitment division of Corning will be distributing the cards at various conventions throughout the country. There were 10,000 cards issued with 10 minutes of time.

New from Grapevine Telecards is a tasty three-card set promoting Corn
 Nuts. Each card has 10 units of time by Teledebit and there were only 700 matched numbered sets produced. This is a card that is available through phonecard dealers.

Caymen Resources recently issued a really interesting four-card set of the four major Credit card issuers. The set titled the Credit Card

Collection, actually was issued as a promotional piece for retail merchants in the Union Square shopping district of San Francisco. Only 500 matched numbered sets were issued with each card having five units of Cable \& Wireless time and a full color back as well. The back of each card also has all four credit card logos. It is amazing to realize that these prepaid cards carry images of credit cards! A unique set that may still be available from dealers.

Also from Caymen Resources is a Mexicana Airlines card - 400 cards issued with most being presented to Mexican employees traveling to Europe for Airbus training. The card has "Global One" branding with the logos of Sprint, Deutsche Telecom and France Telecom.

Finally this month, don't forget to keep an eye out for specially marked boxes of General Foods cereal. Certain boxes will contain a 30 -minute Sprint card featuring one of your favorite superstars from the NFL (See November's "Corporate Corner" for more details.). Odds of finding a card inside are 1 in 301.

Next month, we'll take a look back at some of the most popular corporate/promotional cards of 1997 with our Corporate Corner year in review.

Turn on a television set on any weekend afternoon and the beer commercials pour forth. It is little wonder then, that beer-themed cards have made the leap onto one of the hottest new promotional mediums - prepaid phonecards. And it should be no surprise that such images have found their way into the hearts, and collections, of phonecard enthusiasts.

While not in a league with Coca-Cola or even Pepsi as a phonecard collectible, beer-themed cards have carved out their own niche. Collectors with a taste for soft drinks should read November's "Drinking It In" feature, which shows the allure of nonalcoholic drink images.

Bruce Harmon, whose Acme Telecard dealership specializes in promotional cards, says there's a steady market for alcoholic images on cards, especiälly beer logos and themes. Probably half as many collectors are interested in the thematic compared to soft drink cards, he estimates.
"I've found on beer cards, it really depends on the brand name," he says. "The more popular the beer, the more popular the card. The Provident Worldwide Stroh's card (1,000 10-minute cards issued in late 1996) is really nice, but since it isn't one of the major brands, there wasn't as much interest in the cards." That same Stroh's image is getting another go-round on a soon-to-bereleased issue by Winston-Taylor, he says.

A walk around Promo Expo '97 in Chicago in September confirmed that

beer-themed cards continue to be hot promotions. (Please see separate article on Page 46). Just released in September by SmarTel were a couple of five-minute telecards for Miller Lite. One pictures an "Xtreme Summer" surfboard rider, and the other features the New York Skyline with some Lite bottles taking the place of the World Trade Towers. Both giveaway cards are affixed to holders that are usable postcards. The telecards and the postcards to which they are affixed say "Must be at least 21 years of age to use phone service."

Some cards have been very popular, Harmon notes. There are quite a few different Red Dog Beer images - OmniTel, Frontier, Communications Design Group and ITS among them - and Miller cards by Incomm/U.S. South, Omnitel and Phonecard Express also have been consistently sought. Beer giant Budweiser has had successful card programs under a now-expired exclusive deal with GTI (now a division of Smartalk Teleservices), including the very popular cards done in August and September 1995 showing the Budweiser frogs and ants.

A three-card logo set by SmarTel, for the Anheuser-Busch group of beers also was among the phonecard examples at Promo Expo '97. The individual versions distinctly show Budweiser, Bud Light and Michelob logos, and at least 100,000 of the five-minute cards were issued in an ongoing program.

In December 1993, GTI issued its first in a series of cards for Budweiser. The first card featured the Bud One

Airship and there were 112,500 issued for each of 1.5 -unit and 10-unit denominations, plus 22,500 of a Spanish version. Groups of $10-$ and 20 -unit GTI cards were released in December 1994 showing various subjects: a frosty bottle with the heads of their Clydesdale horses; the Bud Ice Draft logo, and the Clydesdales pulling a wagon. In July 1995, they issued more in the series, in both $\$ 5$ and $\$ 10$ denominations: cards with the Bud Light logo; cans of regular Bud plus the heads of Clydesdale horses; and the Bud Ice logo.


Now-defunct OmniTel's "Lite Beer -
Life is Good" card (5,000 issued) was distributed at bars in the Boston area in October 1995. The Miller Beer logo also is on the ITS/Root B Productions' 5 -minute "Kentucky Derby at 122 " card issued in April 1996. The 5,000 live cards feature racing cans of Miller, Miller Lite and Miller Genuine Draft.

Those three brews are on another Miller card showing the holiday spirit (spirits?). Frontier issued the "Home for the Holidays" card in 1996.

OmniTel also used the Red Dog logo on many issues: In early 1995, cards featuring the beer pooch were featured on 5 -minute cards for the Charlie Horse tavern and Fun 107 radio station; for Fun 107's Birthday Bash; for the Irish Embassy Pub; and for the Pour House tavern. Around August 1995, The crimson canine showed up again in the center of 2,000 cards that OmniTel issued for the Doc \& Nellie's Grill, which featured the football schedule for the New England Patriots.

In November 1995, ITS issued two cards in a quantity of 500 each, for regional offices and distributors of Red Dog to use as they liked for promotions (such as giving one to customers with each pack bought, etc.). One card has the slogan, "You Are Your Own Dog" and the other showed a large version of the mug of the pug with the name "Red Dog."

Communications Design Group issued two Red Dog "It's Your Call" cards with similar designs in December 1995 and 1996. The first is a 10 -minute card, the latter a 15 -minute card in quantities of 1,200 and 1,700 , respectively. Frontier's Red Dog "Phone Home" card was issued in November 1995. There were 37,500 of that five-minute card issued.

HT Technologies, another since-departed issuer, matched Budweiser and Coca-Cola logos on the Central Washington State Fair card in September 1995; on a card for Beach Boys at Laguna Seca, issued in October 1995; on the Jensen Beach, Fla. Pineapple Festival card, November 1995; and on a '95 Thunderbird Balloon Classic card, 10 units, 3,500 issued, also in November
1995. HT

Other HT cards


Here is a taste of other beer-related cards:
Foster's is "Australian for beer" and American for phonecard by Communications Design Group. There were 1,300 cards issued in December 1996, with $15-\mathrm{min}-$ utes of time and a cheery "G'day, mate!" voice greeting.

Grapevine Telelcards issued a Coors Light card for the "Silver Bullet Blues Festival" in May 1996; Access Telecom issued Heineken cards in June and December 1995; and Phonecard Express issued a Coors / Coors Light card in January 1997. It is a dual collectible, also featuring the Indiana Pacers basketball team.

It is clear that there's plenty brewing for collectors who want to pursue beer-related cards. If that's not enough, here are some added advantages: Not only are they good-looking and useful, but they never will leave you with a hangover !

## QIIK TAKES

NYNEX REFUND PROGRAM DETAILED. The Bell Atlantic-NYNEX merger has spawned a long-awaited refund policy for NYNEX's Change Cards, both the magnetic-backed "Tamura" cards and the earlier optical-stripe Landis \& Gyr cards. The new Bell Atlantic will issue remote-memory cards valid throughout the company's entire expanded service area.

Bell Atlantic also has released mintage figures for both kinds of cards, and has pledged to update those figures after the refund program concludes Jan. 31, 1998. All Change Cards in

stock or accepted through the refund program eventually will be destroyed, although some returned cards haven't been destroyed yet because of unsettled accounts with dealers, says Bell Atlantic Project Manager Richard L. Barrios.

Excluded from the refund program are $\$ 1$ denomination complimentary cards, unless they are a part of a set. Refunds will be made up to the original retail price of the cards.

To obtain refunds for the unused portion of their cards, Change Card holders may call the Change Card customer service hotline, (800) 545-3279, anytime to find the location of redemption centers in New York City. Or Change Card holders can mail their cards directly to:

All refund requests should include the Change Card holder's name, address, Social Security number and should be sent to the above address. All must be submitted by Jan. 31,1998 . The risk of loss for any Change Cards mailed to Bell Atlantic is with the card holder until the cards are actually received, the company notes.

Card holders may wish to consider the following points in regards to the collectors' market, Bell Atlantic says:

- During the past 12 months, NYNEX has destroyed thousands of Change Cards that were either being kept in inventory or had been returned.
- The merger will result in future calling card products being issued under the Bell Atlantic rather than the NYNEX brand name.

How desirable will NYNEX and previously issued Bell Atlantic cards be, now that NYNEX has stopped producing cards and Bell Atlantic might start again? How will the refund policy affect the collectibility of NYNEX cards?
"It will make anything out there by NYNEX a little more valuable once the refunding period is over," says Luis Vigdor of Powell Associates. He expects a lot of cards will be refunded, especially from dealers in Europe who speculated and are holding "tremendous quantities." Vigdor anticipates that both Tamura and Landis \& Gyr cards will increase in value, with the Landis \& Gyr possibly doing a bit better since they are older.

While dealers generally agree that the refund program will result in fewer NYNEX cards and thus the potential for increased value for those that remain, it is difficult to estimate the specific impact until the refunding program ends.

Dealer Steve Eyer anticipates that a lot of cards would be turned in under the refund offer, and that Landis \& Gyr cards could see a 20-40 percent increase in value.

Stephen Schwartz, manager of the Sears Phone Card Department is cautiously optimistic. "I believe the value will be enhanced, assuming that NYNEX will destroy the cards that they take back." It is exciting for the phonecard industry, Schwartz notes, when companies' customer relations policies reflect the customers' best interests.

On the prospect of earlier Bell Atlantic cards gaining desirability once new cards are issued, Vigdor draws a par-
allel between Michigan Bell and Ameritech cards. Even though Michigan Bell is part of Ameritech, those early cards are still important. "I believe Michigan Bell is the cornerstone of building a U.S. collection," he notes.

Some generalities about the NYNEX-
Bell Atlantic situation can be stated without hesitation:

Cards from "dead"
systems rarely grow in popularity, although the refund program could muddy that generalization. The optical-stripe Landis \& Gyr Change Cards were produced by from 1991 and 1994. They were then replaced by the new style of magnetic cards using long-proven Japanese technology, which were well received by collectors. Since NYNEX was still in business, the optical-stripe cards also remained popular.

However, in February, NYNEX announced they were curtailing the use of stored-memory phonecards. This caused a decline in interest of collecting both the optical and magnetic NYNEX phonecards. In fact, some dealers panicked, and tried dumping their holdings of NYNEX Change Cards.

The reasons for a decline in popularity are mainly psychological. Nothing else has changed about the phonecards; obviously the designs, denominations, and quantities are the same as they have always been. But who ever said that collecting was logical?

This latest development is different, though. Bell Atlantic essentially bought NYNEX. Bell Atlantic used to
issue phonecards, but stopped. NYNEX used to issue phonecards, too. It stopped producing storedvalue cards, but would still be selling remote-memory phonecards
 had it not been for the merger. In fact, the same people involved with previously running the NYNEX Prepaid Cards program actually will be running the new Bell Atlantic program. Once the new Bell Atlantic cards appear, the situation could be viewed, as Powell's Vigdor anticipates, as similar to Michigan Bell and Ameritech. NYNEX and early Bell Atlantic cards may turn out to be precursors and historically significant cards leading up to the new Bell Atlantic issues.

So, the questions remain: Will NYNEX Change Cards still be popular? Will NYNEX Prepaid Cards still be popular? And, will the old Bell Atlantic cards now become popular again? These are decisions that collectors ultimately will make. How about sharing your views on this important topic via letters to the editor of Moneycard Collector magazine?

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[^2]ARMY RECRUITS USING FIRST UNION CARDS. Moneycards issued to new recruits at the U.S. Army's Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri are being used by those soldiers, but not only at the base. According to a First Union spokeswoman, there have been instances where recruits have used the cards in Atlanta, where Visa Cash was introduced at the 1996 Summer Olympics.
The year-long pilot program, the first Visa Cash pilot with government involvement, began in May, and is being funded by the U.S. Department of Treasury.

On the base, the cards can be used to pay for personal items, such as toiletries and haircuts. There are two card denominations - a $\$ 200$ version for male recruits and a $\$ 260$ version for women, on the theory that women's supplies cost more. At the end of basic training, any unused portion will be credited to the soldiers' military payroll

accounts.
The cards feature Schlumberger chips and contain a signature panel on the reverse for identification purposes. However, the card reverses also include the cautions: "Disposable Visa Cash Card" and "Treat this card like cash, if lost or stolen, it will not be replaced."

INTERNET LIST TO PROMOTE HOBBY. A free Internet list designed to promote the moneycard hobby through swaps, trading, buying, selling and telecard auctions is now available to dealers and collectors. Ivan White of Redfield, S.D., has created the list for telecards and related themes, including cash cards. In its first week, about 85 subscribers signed up, White says. To sign up, send an e-mail message to [majordomo@listservice.ne](mailto:majordomo@listservice.ne)> and enter "subscribe phonecards" in the body area of the message, not the subject area. When that request is confirmed, respond to that confirmation number to complete your subscription request.

COMPUSERVE EXPANDS TELECARD PRESENCE. CompuServe's new Telecards Forum is a major expansion of the older "Phone \& Money Cards" section which began operation in 1994.

The new Forum has 26 individual "mini-forums" or sections which have specialized message boards, libraries and chat rooms for telcos, distributors, manufacturers and collectors. Among the current mini-forums are "U.S. Telecards," "World Telecards," "Other Moneycards," an online (live) auction area, separate sections for Moneycard Collector magazine, PCM Report Magazine, the International Phonecard Collectors organization, and the International Telecard Association. Additional nocharge forums will be added for industry organizations as requests are received.
A private dealer section also has been opened, at no additional charge, and is available only to bona-fide dealers and distributors. The Moneycards/Telecards Dealer Net (no connection to Moneycard Collector magazine) is a secure network for dealer/distributor trading and allows wholesale buy/sell transactions similar to existing networks for coin and stamp dealers. Direct connection from such services as America Online, Prodigy and AT\&T WorldNet (through the World Wide Web) to the Telecards Forum is expected to be ready before year's end.

In its first month, the expanded Telecards Forum added 400 active collectors to its membership rolls and hosted nearly 3,000 collector messages.

PHONECARDS AND POLITICS. A column in the Sept. 18 Washington Times used phonecards to take a poke at Vice President Al Gore. The following is from the Times' "Inside The Beltway" column:

The vice president hasn't joined the ranks of celebrity pitchmen, but a full-color mock advertisement posted around Capitol Hill gave this column a chuckle:
"Vice President Al Gore for MCI* Pre-Paid Phone Cards ... 'A tough job like mine means I must be ready to make crisp, clear phone calls instantly, any time, anywhere - local, national and overseas.
"'That's why I prefer the convenience of MCI* PrePaid Phone Cards. There's so simple to use! No matter if I'm calling friendly donors in Asia, Buddhist temples in L.A. .... or simply hitting up Washington big shots for hard money gifts for the DNC, those MCI* Pre-Paid Phone Cards are simple, quick... and best of all, untraceable!
"'So take it from me. When it's time to (go) dialing for dollars, use MCI* Pre-Paid Phone Cards. They give you the controlling authority you need.'
"MCI* - Money Collected Illegally."

One card shows a color photo of the Morganton, N.C., school, the other is a sketch.

## Manitoba Telecom Services (MTS)

Two more members of the Stentor Alliance have joined the trend toward issuing chip-based phonecards: Sasktel, serving Saskatchewan; and MTS, serving Manitoba. MTS' field trial at the beginning of 1997 placed telephones in areas of high payphone traffic: universities and northern mining towns were the prime areas for the field trial. The first two cards issued, in $\$ 2$ and $\$ 5$ denominations, show school supplies and telephone equipment arranged to look like people. More recently a set of three cards was issued to promote the Canada Games held in Brandon, Manitoba. and shows athletes and payphones in a wheat field. A $\$ 20$ sunset card was produced to accommodate the long-distance needs of Mexican farm workers on a farm in Elie, Manitoba, and is only sold at the farm. Another $\$ 2$ card promotes the Call Answer service and was given out to new subscribers to the service.

Sasktel's chip cards did not arrive at press time, but will be shown in an upcoming issue.

While the cards share the name QuickChange with Telus and Bell Canada, and are used in similar Nortel Millenium payphones, they are not currently interoperable across different jurisdictions.

## Canada Payphone Corporation (CPC)

From British Columbia comes news of the first chipbased machine-readable prepaid phonecards from a non-Stentor company.

CPC plans to carry two


Canada Payphone / Satellite Satellite Stations; \$20 and \$50 denominations; 1,500 of each issued; 1997. types of payphones. Satellite payphones already are installed in some remote mining and oil towns in northern Alberta, where it would be impractical to install land lines; and on ships operating in the waters of Atlantic Canada. Land-line payphone trials in the greater Vancouver area, offering both local and long-distance service, ran from March 15 to Oct. 15. Separate
phonecards were produced for the different payphones, as well as a 15 minute Internet access card (complete details of which were unavailable at press time). Cards can be purchased by mail order at face value from the company.

CPC's payphones also accept Canadian and American coins, including the "twonie" ( $\mathrm{C} \$ 2$ coin) which Stentor pay phones do not.

## Westel

Two new batches of cards have been released by this B.C.-based company, one in April and one in July. Both batches continue the colorful tourist-oriented images of British Columbia. Westel has also begun selling its cards outside B.C., in tourist areas as far east as Niagara Falls, Ontario; and some of the new designs reflect other parts of Canada - such as grain elevators from the Prairies and a bull rider.

## SHOU STOPPERS

5earching for cards at the Telecard World Expo at the Javits Center in late September should have been easy. Not so! Several cards were only available upon close questioning, and one pair was not even for sale! But diligence and an expenditure of shoe leather paid off, and soon the list of show cards grew to at least twice the official list of cards, which were competing for prizes of best of show.

Top of the show and always very clever was Continental Plastics, whose collective brainstorming group produced a set of delightful die-cut taxicabs, each with a celebrity giving the world advice as he flies by on the way to Javits. Take your choice of Don King, Siskel \& Ebert, Mr. Spock, Elvis, or John Wayne. Only 100 sets were available at the show, and were sold out the first day.

Runner up was SSI with the world's largest "swipe card." The card breaks away from its carrier and becomes a jumbo $(1,000)$.

Honorable mentions went to Zenex, with a speeding taxi design that reads " 5 miles" as the denomination (the card reverse warns that it's really 5 minutes); WorldWide Digital, with a double-sided color taxi theme; ValNet, with a New York license plate and the lowest mintage
of the publicized cards (100); Phonecards, Etc., a 10 -minute card with a lovely red apple behind the New York skyline (500); and my favorite, CPDI, showing the construction of the Empire State Building. They used an old photo as a starting point. Not entered in the award competition was another favorite by Innovative Telecom showing nearby New Jersey ex-resident, one A.G. Bell with, of all things, a telephone ( 1,000 ). Gimmickry and cleverness aside with the other cards, these latter two cards portrayed truly historical events.

Also unveiled was a "dinner card set" produced for the inaugural dinner of the ITA's International Telecard Foundation. The dinner was followed by an auction to help fund the foundation, which will support consumer education and protection activities. The six-card puzzle set, designed by Creative Communications and printed by Jericho Printing, forms the Statue of Liberty's head, PINs are by AT\&T, MCI, Smartalk, SNET, Teltrust and World Com. Creative, Jericho and all of the telcos donated services to this effort for the benefit of ITA. Each card has five minutes or units of time, and there were 350 sets produced.

Among the auction items were the first two copies of the Moneycard Collector Catalog, the first signed by staff members and the second signed by company representatives who attended the dinner. Those catalogs brought $\$ 260$ and $\$ 290$ respectively. A reserve bid of $\$ 500$ had been placed by USACard's Klaus Degler for the first Moneycard Collector Catalog but somehow it was omitted and Ron Contrado of Homisco got a bargain. Another auction item of note was another AT\&T Illicall Teleticket,

which sold for a very low $\$ 1,900$. Earlier this year, an Illicall card sold for $\$ 5,050$.

The 500 decks, with time by Smartalk, are mostly different since all the cards in the deck were used, and both the top and bottom captions change. The number of possibilities of these decks may surpass the Gillette frenzy of two years ago. One hobbyist was studying the possibilities of this deck and was last heard muttering uncontrollably to himself. The sign of a good collector!

Galaxy held a party sorry, a networking session - at the All Star Cafe after hours and dispensed randomly four cards to be traded with neighbors for a puzzle set of four.

The 500 sets disappeared quickly. Innovative Telecom again appeared with a 5-Minute Prepaid Ale card from a local microbrewery. Like the version made for the Chicago Intele-Card Expo, the bottle's label was a five-minute telecard, precooled, and served to the crowd at the Javits at 2:45 p.m. each day.

Magellan Network Systems had a 30-minute card numbered to 700 with the PIN exposed. Magellan
 only gave the card out to people who begged. The show sponsors, Multimedia, had an entry telecard with the Empire State Building at dusk (3,000). Phonecards, Etc./ East West Telecom issued a regular-sized puzzle set of two showing the skyline of New York (230), as well as a jumbo set of the same design (20).

East West Telecom produced a bevy of cards with AT\&T as the carrier, including a round die-cut tie-dyed card with what could be a beanie baby bear looking out of a taxi (500); the same card image repeated as the centerpiece of a rectangular jumbo card (100) and a pin encapsulated, with a flashing light atop a N.Y. taxi. This comes complete with PIN number and carries five minutes of time (25).

Cable \& Wireless weighed in with a fiveminute show card against a northern hemisphere backdrop (300). The PhoneCard Group had a very nice cartoon-like Statue of Liberty with telephone in hand, quantity unknown. Standard Register showed us a nice skyline in pastel, $(1,000)$.

The Principality of Andorra released a nice chip card at the show in honor of TCW NY97, but with no TCW Show logo. The 50 -unit card, 12,000 made, features a vintage Ferrari on the obverse and a classic Morgan two-seater on the reverse.

All in all, this was a very nice group of show cards. See you next year at the Javits!

# Events like Promo Expo ${ }^{9} 7$ show growing phonecard presence 

 issuers, the strength of the promotional side of the telecard industry was underlined strongly at the Expo.There's been an explosion of phonecard-related promotions in the past few years, and that's reflected in the growth of the Expo. Two years ago, the event drew about 900 visitors. This year, it was more than 3,000 .

Many promotional cards are a challenge for collectors to find because promoters aren't thinking about collectors, or the cards are aimed at "private

While some are mentioned regularly in Moneycard Collector's "New Issues" or "Corporate Corner" columns, many more never get mentioned because clients don't want promotions known to "outsiders," whose interest might skew their program results.

Here's an example of the scope of promotional phonecards that demonstrates why collectors always will be able to find something fresh and different: A representative at Sprint's booth at the Promo Expo said the telco currently is

Phonecard issuers weren't in abundance in Cleveland at the 18th National Sports Collectors Convention but they were plentiful in Chicago at Promo magazine's Promo Expo '97, held in early September. While August's sports show (Moneycard Collector, November 1997) attracted few

issuing about 40 million cards a year, with 150-200 new cards each month.

One of Sprint's newest promotions is a whopping 7.1 million cards done to promote the opening of Sprint Stores inside more than 7,000 Radio Shacks nationwide. Visitors to the Radio Shack stores between Sept. 21 and Oct. 2 could receive a free special Cartoon Network card showing "The Jetsons" cartoon characters. There were 6.85 million five-minute versions done, plus 200,000 with 20 minutes of time and 50,00060 -minute cards, all with "Jumpin' Jupiter!" peel-offs covering the PINs and denominations. The new Sprint Stores feature not only telephones, but most also sell various versions of their regular Spree Prepaid Foncards.

Sprint's booth showcased only a tiny number of the many fascinating cards they have done, and they gave out well-designed packets to try to drum up customprinting business (with examples of various types of products: postcard mailers, coupon cards, Lift \& Peel, a Gas-N-Go Coupon book - including one containing a 1927 Bentley, Cello-wrap Combo, Greeting Card, Tent Card and Geo-Coded Docucard.

As the National Football League's official telecommunications provider, Sprint also distributed 10 minute cards featuring a big NFL logo surrounded by all the team logos.

Although perhaps not as big as the Sprint promotions, there was a lot of other phonecard activity abundant at the Expo, as issuers showed off not only recent examples of cards, but also cards issued earlier this year or in 1996.

Cable \& Wireless representatives eagerly showed new card concepts to people visiting their booth. Introduced at the Expo was an interactive jumbo oval card trumpeting "A Universe of Promotional Stars! Imagine the Possibilities!" At the card's center is a plastic bubble that can hold something related to a customer's business (such as sand for a beach resort) - the show version held tiny foil stars. There were 3,000 of the novel 10 -minute cards issued.

Also demonstrated at the $\mathrm{C} \& \mathrm{~W}$ booth was a Greeting Card series, which allows people to leave personal mes-

sages for people calling in to use the card given as a gift. One example was a Santa Claus card: Kids could call to leave a list of presents they hoped to get for Christmas, and parents and grandparents could call in later to listen.

Always-active Frontier had a large presence promoting its services. To help draw a crowd, they had "Macho Man" Randy Savage sign autographs at the booth. They even created a special $10-$ minute "Go Face To Face With A Savage" card to honor the event. Produced by Kobel, the punch-out card is part of one side of a larger card, which then peels off from a business reply mail card offering more information about Frontier services.

In addition, the walls of Frontier's booth highlighted their famous 10 -minute Kit Kat candy card from 1995, and their two new 15 -minute "Men in Black" cards featuring Tommie Lee Jones and Will Smith (Moneycard Collector, "New Issues," October 1997.)

At the GE Exchange booth, a blister-packed, pup-pet-figured "Talk to Santa" card was featured. It offers services similar to the C\&W card - five minutes of calling time for a child to leave a "wish list" that adults hear by calling in later.

GTS had a handsome display showeasing past and new products done under both that name and the Global Link division. It's a big world of commerce out there: GTS has agents in 57 nations, and sells cards in about 159 different countries! Also interesting was the "Pets in Need" phonetag, which attaches to the collar of a pet, and allows anyone finding the animal to call a toll-free number and be connected to the owner.

Sporting their always-strong promotional presence were the folks from ITS. The ITS booth featured the "Super Mario" card pictured on the cover of the April 1997 Moneycard Collector, as well as a new 5-minute "MarioKart 64 " card, quantity 5,000 , issued in April as a possible prize for those correctly answering questions in Nintendo Power magazine and a 10 -minute card (exp.12/31/97) picturing George Clooney and Michelle Pfeifer in the Fox Video film "One Fine Day."

At the PromoTel booth, you could see a number of interesting cards, including a specimen of the live 10 minute Hillshire Farms card issued in April 1997 and given away on a coupon-bearing holder to those sending in proofs-of-purchase; it's been so popular, they've already done three printings, for around 50,000 total cards); and a great-looking Kellogg's Christmas-time 1996 card showing Tony the Tiger, Snap Crackle \& Pop and the Sugar Smacks' "Dig EM" frog.

There was a sample of PromoTel's 15-minute Dr. Pepper decal card which was affixed randomly to cans of the soda in vending machines. It was such a popular promotion (winning a 1996 Dialog award, and resulting in a 15 percent increase in average sales of the product), that there will be two more such programs: a repeat of the original idea (which will probably double the 50,000 or so cards already done), plus a new '98 program.

PromoTel also displayed a new 10 -minute card featuring a frostylooking bottle of Avalon water, as well as a "Nestlé Bakes The Very Best" promotional card: 10-minute samples were sent out to various retailers, advising that anyone doubling their orders of the new downsized 12-pack case of Libby's Pumpkin Pie filling would get a live 10-minute card.

One of the country's most active issuers of promotional phonecards has been SmarTel, a merger partner earlier this year with Smartalk. Now known as Smartalk Promotional, the company's booth showed loads of interesting cards, including a 5 minute Blue Cross of North Carolina card, 25-30,000 issued; a Canon Super G3 copier, about 5,500 issued; and possibly the first "luggage card," consisting of a luggage tag to which was affixed a 15 -minute "Canon America's \# 1 Copier 15 Years In A Row" card, issued in July 1997.

Recent SmarTel-branded cards will

ITS; MarioKart 64; 5 minutes; 5,000 issued; April 1997. appeal to a variety of collectors - a new 20 -minute Dannon Natural Spring Water card, 4,500 issued in June 1997 and a 10 -minute Duracell card issued as an onpack promo in March 1997; 300,000 issued. Other new SmarTel cards includes one for Nestlé Food Services featuring the company's Chef-mate, Carnation and Trio logos; a card for the SportsLine Internet site showing Joe Namath, a Webster's New World Dictionary card and a card promoting Sunny Delight orange drink.

Among the promo cards bearing the Smartalk name are a $\$ 20$ card for Gooding's featuring a bowl of peaches, and a \$15 Halloween-themed card for Schwegmann's Giant Supermarket.

It is likely that promotions will continue to cause commotions among collectors, so the best advice is to keep your eyes peeled, because there are more interesting cards available out there than you might expect!

[^2]:    ETTING SMART IN THE BIG APPLE. The long-awaited New York smart-card test is under way in Manhattan. Beginning in early October, Chase Manhattan Bank and Citibank were to distribute an estimated 25,000 smart cards each to customers on the Upper West Side (west of Central Park and between West 60th and West 96th streets). The Chase Banking cards are a Mondex product, while Citibank cards are a Visa Cash stored-value product.
    Both cards are historically significant for collectors.
    Chase's card is the first stand-alone Mondex card, while Citibank's card, which, we are pleased to note, reads "Money Card" across the front, is the first Visa Cash by that bank.
    The New York Smart Card Program is a joint effort among Chase, Citibank, MasterCard and Visa and is the first such test in the New York market. The program is, in essence, as much an introduction of a new product as it is a test, says Alice Dayton, account executive for Makovsky \& Co., the New York firm handling public relations for the program. It is expected to last six months, but could run longer if well received. Upper Westsiders who do not have an account with either bank could get a stand-alone smart card by visiting Chase and Citibank branches on the Upper West Side in October.
