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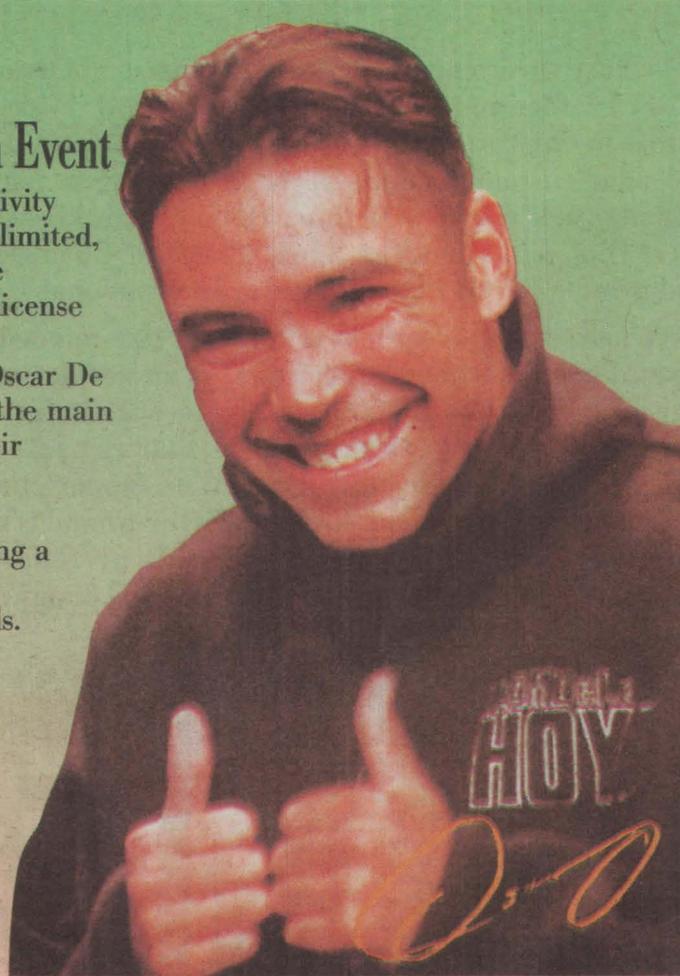

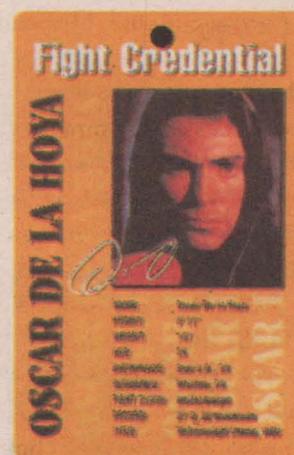

ON THE MONEY

A recent stroll through the bourse at the ANA Money Show in Cincinnati gave me a fresh perspective on our moneycard hobby.

There were tables stacked with the silver, gold and paper currency that have defined so much American and world history. Roman and Greek coins from the dawn of civilization were just a penny's pitch away from the latest commemoratives. If you have never attended a major coin show, then we encourage you to do so.

The sense of history was overwhelming, and so was the sense of sameness. Selby Ungar's Carson City King phonecard display was a welcome oasis of color amid the fields of green, silver, gold and bronze. His cases of cards, side by side with his coins and notes, underlined a fundamental difference that proves once more that numismatics and

moneycard collecting are complementary hobbies, not competitors.

Moneycard collecting, whether it is stored-value chip cards, phonecards, prepaid gasoline or transit cards, might only be able to show a couple of decades of history as compared to coin collecting's couple of millennia, but when it comes to the Zap! Pow! Zing!, we take a back seat to no one.

Collectors who hold a Carson City King card, most of which picture rare coins and notes, can touch an image of something that they may never get a chance to hold during their collecting careers. Rare silver dollar errors, Brasher doubloons, Indian Head gold coins, all are at the collectors' fingertips. And other moneycards bear images that you may never see on coins - Coca-Cola polar bears, Mickey Mouse, Ronald McDonald, the Pink

Panther and literally hundreds of other fascinating images that span the gamut from the corporate world to nature, from entertainment to fund-raisers, from fine art to sports.

It would be foolish in the extreme to suggest that moneycards would supplant numismatics as a collectible. Not only does coin collecting have the centuries in its favor, but it also has a vast base of collectors. Prepaid cards have a vast array of fascinating products, but still have a ways to go before the collector base swells.

One way those ranks could grow is to increase the number of card collector clubs. We invite all moneycard collectors to tell us of their club experiences and share information of club meetings and upcoming events.

We found the dealers and collectors to be gracious and politely

The true beginning of America's prepaid phone cards?

The setting: Miami, Fla., early 1985. The day started just like any other day for me.

I owned a small computer store located in a strip mall. One of the stores neighboring mine was a cellular car phone dealer. He installed those original real big ones that required a 20-pound base station bolted inside the car's trunk.

One day, the cellular dealer came into my store with a big dilemma on his hands. It seemed that the cellular service provider he was selling had blocked all long-distance calls from being made on the phones. Apparently users were buying the phones, putting several thousand dollars worth of air and long-distance time on them, then simply dumping them and getting new ones. It seemed that most of his cus-

tomers, although not the ones dumping the phones, sure were making lots of long-distance calls. His business was down to a trickle.

In came Cellular Security Systems, later to be known simply as CSS, a concept I had been working on in my spare time that involved a protection scheme for the over-the-air portion of cellular calls. One of the parts I did have worked out was the method to pass calls through my scrambling equipment by using a plain old office type phone system, also known as a PBX. It hit me then that this equipment could be a life saver for my distraught neighbor.

Putting it together was actually kind of simple. The Mitel SX-200 PBX I had acquired was set up with eight incoming local lines. The PBX was programmed to automatically answer calls using a then standard feature called Direct Inward System Access or DISA. This feature was

originally a cost-savings function made to allow outside employees to call into their company's phone system, enter a six-digit PIN code, then be connected to the company's outbound WATS line to place a long-distance call. At the time, the only way for a small company to get long-distance discounts was to get one of these WATS lines. So the PIN number and call transfer portion was now in place.

The next step was to get the prepaid portion going. The Mitel PBX came with a serial output port that was used to print a detail of each call it processed. It was just a matter of connecting this port to a computer and writing a program that would maintain and update a database of the DISA PINs. And thus, a new business was born.

By the late 1980s, my sales were about \$200,000. My customers numbered in the few hundred and

were mostly repeats.

By the early 1990s, I was able to consolidate everything into a single PC using products from what was then a little unknown company called Dialogic. By 1992 sales reached more than \$1 million and my cards were being sold from California to New York.

Eventually, I got out of retail distribution and dedicated myself to the development and sale of the debit card systems themselves.

Today, I have installations from Canada to England. In fact, the European and Canadian systems were the first of their kind as well.

And that's the way it was. Just another day.

READERS ALWAYS WRITE

Using cards will help collector numbers grow

All too often, the telephone cards being issued are for the collector market only, not the consumer market. These cards almost are always overpriced with telephone time costing one dollar or more a minute. Not a bad profit! Generally, the profit is made by the issuer or first seller and those purchasing the cards thereafter seldom will see a profit from these cards. However, they are more than likely to see a loss in the cards' value as time passes.

To make matters worse, those collecting this type of card generally can't afford to use the card. Let's say you purchase one of these hot issues with 10 minutes of time for \$20. You have paid \$2 per minute for the card, but worse yet, if you use the card, the card value drops to \$2 or maybe even \$1. Just look at the used card pricers in the *Moneycard Collector Catalog*. The card's value is in being kept "Mint" even though the time on the card may expire in six months to a year and the card price may fall anyway.

I have never been able to figure out how card values are determined. Let us go back to our 10-minute, \$20 card. Say 1,000 of the cards were issued. If one of the cards is used, its value drops to \$2, while the Mint card is still valued at \$20. With exposed PINs on many cards, you can put a used card on the table next to a Mint card and you wouldn't be able to tell the difference unless you tried to use it. Why, then, is the used card worth one-tenth the value of the Mint card? There still are only 1,000 cards in existence.

With the poor thought going into pricing used cards in catalogs, it is no won-

der collectors are afraid to use the cards they purchase. Until people in the United States begin using telephone cards, the collector base will remain small. We have created the problem we are in and have created a small exclusive market with little collector growth.

I started collecting telephone cards in 1991 and currently trade cards with collectors in 26 countries. As one of my trading partners in New Zealand once told me, "What am I going to do with a Mint U.S. card over here?" He wanted mostly used U.S. and Caymen Islands cards from me in good collectible condition. Unused cards were not any different than used cards in his album. Do these countries understand the hobby better than we do?

It is my opinion that Mint U.S. cards generally are over-valued and many certainly are overpriced at \$1 and \$2 a minute. Used cards, especially those in basically the same condition as their Mint counterparts, definitely are under valued and, sad to say, under priced. This is a situation that needs to be corrected, and yesterday would have been a good time to start.

We have long been an advocate of using cards, but used prices in the Moneycard Collector Catalog are a snapshot in time, an attempt to reflect what the market situation is, not what we hope it could be. Creating a price just because it sounds "right" doesn't reflect the reality of the marketplace and misleads collectors.

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Detailed grading not necessary

In regards to Mr. Ivan White's "Guest Commentary" (*Moneycard Collector*, April 1998) about moneycards needing a grading system, I agree fully. However, I'd like to make another suggestion for a grading system that more closely conforms to the language that most of us are already familiar with at this time.

MINT CONDITION (M) = original unused condition as received from the manufacturer or issuer in original packaging with no visible marks or scratches.

NEAR MINT CONDITION (NM) = original unused condition with very minor visible marks or scratches; removed from original packaging and put into new plastic sleeve or collector album.

GOOD CONDITION (G) = used (e.g. scratch-off removed, partial value unloaded from the chip, etc.); shows minor marks or scratches.

FAIR CONDITION (F) = used (e.g. scratch-off removed, partial value unloaded from the chip, etc.); shows noticeable use with heavy scratches or marks.

POOR CONDITION (P) = badly worn or abused or bent; image and printing faded or worn.

I see no need, in this hobby, to get anymore detailed than that since grading is so subjective and is not done by a "professional grading service" like the coin-collecting business. Some of the language of Mint and Near Mint may have to be refined to reflect the way cards are packaged (or not packaged) by the manufacturer or issuer.

A grading system like this should be printed in the front part of the *Moneycard Collector Catalog* and on a regular basis in this publication so that some standard is present and understood.

And since I'm on the subject of the *Moneycard Collector Catalog* I'd like to make another suggestion for improvement. I would like to see an index printed in the back which would make it extremely helpful to find cards of like subjects (e.g. Coca-Cola, McDonalds, airplanes, dolls, animals, city skylines, etc.) printed by different manufacturers. Since I would find this extremely helpful, I'm sure thousands of other collectors would also.

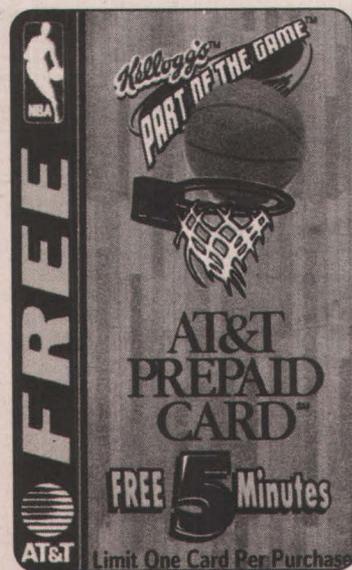

The cereal manufacturer has begun a large on-pack promotion on boxes of several of its cereal brands, including of Raisin Bran, Corn Flakes, Corn Pops and Mini Wheats. The box fronts read "Free AT&T Prepaid Card Free 5 Minutes Limit 1 card Per Purchase."

The cards must literally be cut out from the cardboard box. You must call AT&T and give the cereal's UPC code to be given a PIN.

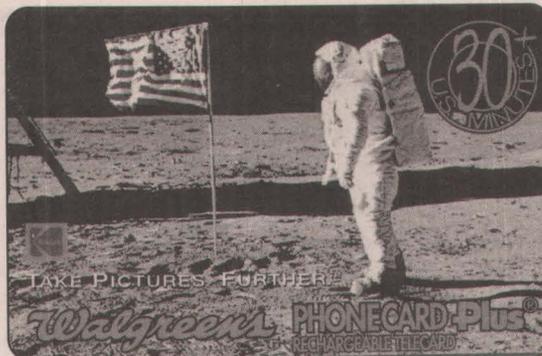

GETTING STARTED

Selling your extra collectibles

Most collectors have considered selling their parts of their collections or at least the extras that gather. Some have had success, and others have been frustrated.

Mainly those who have put a little thought into what makes a successful package that will appeal to a dealer, auctioneer or another collector have been very successful. Those who just "throw out" their collections without thought have been unsuccessful or have been frustrated. So why is it so difficult for some? Let us see the light!

First of all, like any hobby, low-priced items are not too good for resale because of the handling

cost involved in preparing each item for resale. Also newer items, those less than four or five years old, haven't enough age to build up their demand (and price) to be of much interest. It is the higher-priced items that dealers or collectors are interested in, because the handling cost can be "buried" in the total price of the item.

Collectors and dealers likely have the common low-priced items already and the addition of one more is not exactly what they had in mind!

The high-priced items are the ones not in most collections and that is where the demand is. These are not the cards issued in the last few years, although there are exceptions. If a collector needs the telecard, he will buy it if it's priced "right"; and a dealer will be glad to add it to his stock if he believes he can sell it soon.

Handling cost

Your offering should be just

those items that I have discussed above. The others, the low-priced items, must be calculated low enough to allow the handling cost to be added and still give an attractive price to the collector or dealer. Seldom does this allow a price high enough to please the seller.

What is this handling cost? First, the time spent to look up the item must be calculated, to correctly attribute it for a fixed-price listing or an auction. If mail sales are not the goal, calculate the time to research the item and place a price on it in preparation for a show or notebook display. Unless photographic memory is involved, this process takes between three and five minutes.

What if the item is not listed? Then more research or a telephone call is involved. It is easy to spend 10 minutes researching an item and another five minutes preparing it for sale. That is \$5 at a rate of \$20 per hour. Sometimes an hour or so is necessary on an elusive

item. And that item might not be rare or high priced. Add the holder, the other supplies and you see that when a dealer says it costs \$7 to add any item to inventory, he may not be too far off. Now carefully ask yourself if it is worthwhile to include items that retail less than \$10 in your offering. It is best to keep them and let them mature for a while longer or plan to sell them yourself by another means.

What's in demand?

The next goal after deleting the low-priced items is to offer what is in demand. It will do no good to offer something, no matter what the price, if there is not a good demand. Demand is in the eye of the buyer, so seek someone who wants what you have. Generally that is someone who sells the same cards as you are selling.

If you have Mickey Mouse for sale, try the consistent sellers of Mickey Mouse. If that doesn't pro-

We now see collectors buying what they like which are cards we have recommended for over four years. In Europe, which is where the collecting began, sales continue to be strong. Due to the recent recession in Asia, the market has weakened, but there are still many collectors. Sales continue to be good led by Disney, Coca-Cola and theme-type collecting. When you consider that over 20,000 different phone cards were introduced in the last three years, something had to give. We predict that phone cards will have up and down periods over the next five years, but today's market offers tremendous buying opportunity at realistic prices.

We hope everyone enjoys our new changes. If you have any suggestions, please let us know. duce the result you seek, then use the Theory of Contrary Thinking. Go to someone who has none and perhaps he will see the benefit of adding something entirely new.

The above assumes you are selling directly to a dealer or collector. That's not the only way! The next paragraphs will look at some of the alternate methods of selling. Most of these take a lot more time than we have discussed. So be prepared to spend some time!

Classified ads are a fun way to meet new collectors and at the same time sell some of your extras. Two methodologies are widely used: Price each card and put it in the ad. This can get very expensive unless the ads are complimentary. Check *Moneycard Collector* each month; a free classified word ad for magazine subscribers is a current special offering. Most magazines charge between 25 and 40 cents

per word.

Good ads are brief for two reasons: cost and readability. The second method of classified advertising is to announce

the availability of a collection of coins for sale by price list. Solicit addresses and send a price list. This is more work, but allows you to present hundreds of cards simultaneously.

You may wish to trade for other cards with traders. Again, *Moneycard Collector's* new "Trading Post" feature is one way that subscribers can swap cards. There are thousands of traders

around the world who seldom purchase cards, but have some connection

for getting their stock of desirable material replenished, and can then trade this material for other cards for their collections, or sometimes just to trade some more.

There are many trading clubs around the world and the cost of joining is usually just a few of your extra cards.

Many lifetime friendships can be formed this way, but if you are impatient, a trade by mail can take several months to consummate! Even by Internet, the trade can take a month. Usually the trade is just a few cards at a time, so the

postman takes a huge cut, sometimes 10-30 percent.

Internet sales

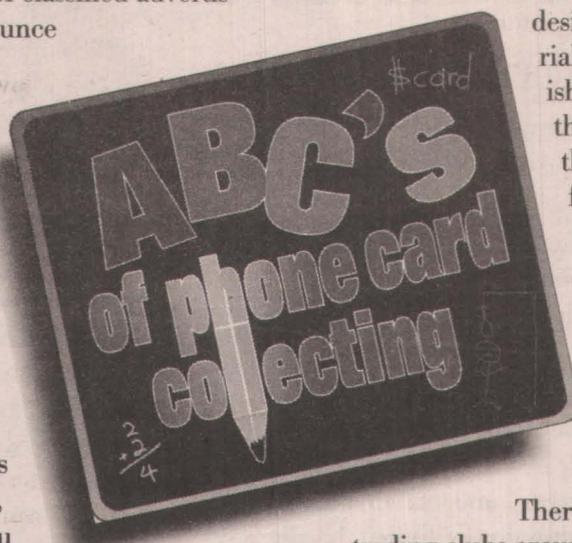
Internet sales can take any form imaginable, but the possibilities are intriguing. There are four or five places where telecard collectors. You can offer by fixed price, or by auction. You may decide to run your own auction or to go to one of the standard addresses and pay someone to do it for you.

You can offer to trade, or you can contact other collectors and dealers about your extras or your whole collection. If you are set up for Internet surfing, send me an e-mail message and I will give you a number of links to explore.

Coke momentum

Licensing questions don't deter collectors

The popularity of Coca-Cola from its beginnings as a health tonic of a hundred years ago to the world's No. 1 best-selling carbonated beverage of today resembles the development of Coca-Cola phonecards.

First, collectors drank in the "real thing" - powerful originals licensed by Coca-Cola - released April 1995 at The World of Coca-Cola Pavilion in Atlanta. Next came what might be called "Diet Coke" - phonecards issued for officially sanctioned promotions or in conjunction with approved events. Sugar- and caffeine-free Coke looks like the real stuff, but connoisseurs know there's hardly any punch in it at all - and some phonecards releases are just that way.

Then there are the generic brands - imitations, but always a risk because who knows how good they'll be. Your Coke choice depends on your taste!

Collectors realize the difference between an officially licensed Coca-Cola phonecard and an approved or officially sanctioned promotion or event. A licensed produce is designed to make a profit - an agreement is made and royalties paid to Coca-Cola, the corporate entity that produces the syrup that makes the Coke. Score Board held the official license to market Coke cards, while Sprint carried the phone time.

Since Coca-Cola encourages its independent bottlers to use the logo on items given away to support worthwhile events, an officially approved card means no money was paid to use the logo. This produces an interesting medley of co-brands for the collectors - McDonald's, Kodak, Marlboro, Budweiser, Citibank, Visa and Buick - and found from Fleet Week in San Francisco to Charlotte Motor Speedway, N.C.

Whether Coke is No. 1 or No. 2 in collector popularity (the other contender for that title is Disney) is debated by some dealers, they agree that Coca-Cola memorabilia is very popular and

is highly collectible. Asked about Coke cards in general, dealer Steve Eyer stated, "Believe me, Coke phonecards are quiet now, but its collectible appeal in general has been tremendous." This overall popularity leads many collectors to believe that Coke-labeled phonecards are a good value right now.

Steve Schwartz, Sears Phone Card Department, rates Coke as one of the top two collectibles in the world, and points to more than 300 Coca-Cola cards listed in his April 1998 price list as proof of their popularity. Acknowledging that prices have been higher, he explains that many Coke cards were exported abroad, which absorbed the over-production of certain Coke cards. Since officially licensed and officially approved cards seem to be equally desirable to collectors, this is a good time to take advantage of the hundreds of Coke cards available for less than \$10 each.

Sears points out some interesting sets that may have escaped collectors' eyes and can still be bought: Datatel International Ltd.'s six-card Coca-Cola Series (DAT 1/6 in the *Moneycard Collector Catalog*) is definitely Coke and includes the polar bear, the distinctively shaped Coke bottle, and cactus desert. Virtually impossible to find is the IEM Telecom (IEM S11/S14) American NFL Bowl Series, a four-card set commemorating games played in Berlin, Tokyo, London and Barcelona, and co-branded with Kodak.

Mercury Marketing (MMC) produced several Coca-Cola 600 Charlotte Motor Speedway phonecards in 1994 and 1995, as well as the very early "Racing Under the Lights" in 1993. The "Coca-Cola 600" in distinctive red and white script is prominently displayed on the cards. These are a nice blend of the increasingly popular world of car racing, especially Winston Cup NASCAR. Several jumbo cards were also produced, and sample cards can still be found.

Schwartz wonders if the World of Coke No. 6, "Ronald McDonald House, Atlanta," may have been a sore point with ScoreBoard, which uses Sprint time. The two-card set carries the AT&T logo, which makes the set unique among WOC. A recent set that generated a lot of interest was the television program Friends/Diet Coke Series, produced by TekTel Marketing Inc., (TEK). TekTel is known as the producers of the Dillon, Smith and United Supermarkets Coca-Cola Christmas 1994 promotion series.

Final tips from Sears' Schwartz: Collectors not into 50-card sets but looking for an "official licensed" set of nostalgic Coke might like Score Board's set of five clear acetate \$5 phonecards (SBI 502/506), with 2,860 issued in November 1995. The "Drink Coca-Cola" red button abounds in low-priced cards that were produced by the now defunct HT Technologies (HTT). Also look for the distinctive Coke

script on other cards: Grapevine Telecard's "Alexander's World - Times Square Parade" (GRP 9/11) or watch for McDonald's cards like SBI's 953, Card No. 39 of the 1996 series, "Mac At Amusement Park" that show Coke advertising. These cards are also available with striking foil gold arches.

And who produced the "first" U.S. Coke card? Collect-A-Card, Greenville, S.C., claims to have produced the first officially licensed Coca-Cola phonecard in February 1995. Five years in the making, according to distributor Mike DeBoer, these first phonecards were "chase" cards inserted into packs of Coca-Cola-licensed nostalgia trading cards.

Fifteen thousand each of four \$3 cards made up the "Collect Coke" (C-29) sets: Haddon Sundblom "Santa," Rockwell's "Boy Gone Fishin," "Sprite Boy," and "Big Red Coke Machine," and a single \$5 "Home Run," 4,500 issued, were distributed. Some argue these were "promotional" cards that could not be purchased, and so are not really "first."

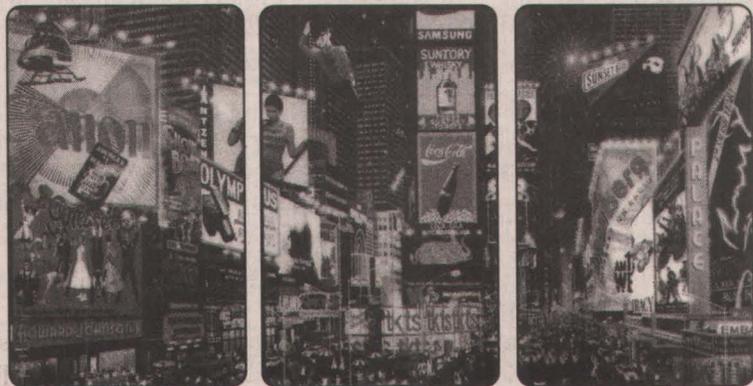
Kathleen and Scott Shapiro, KARS Unlimited, believe that "Coke cards have maintained their value. People still want them - they remain one of the most sought-after issues in the world."

Kathleen Shapiro sees a tremendous foreign market for Coke cards, but has observed that foreign collectors do not want remote memory, but prefer U.S. chip or magnetic cards - especially when collecting Coke. She also feels that U.S. collectors seemed so overwhelmed by the sheer numbers of officially licensed Score Board Coke set that they didn't take time to sort all the issues out. Some people were also confused because they did not realize that the red button logo is also used by local distributors.

Scott Shapiro notes that although U.S. market has slowed down, right now there is a definite trend toward inexpensive items. Collectors who take a long-term view should look at obtaining the classics: the 12 World of Coke officially licensed issues, the first Frank and Sons, and old officially approved event issues. He sees fabulous Coke cards coming from Hong Kong, Australia and Japan. In Hong Kong Colonel Sander's Kentucky Fried Chicken sells Coke, rather than Pepsi, so cards co-banded with both logos are available, which is fun for U.S. collectors.

Collectors, of course, are asking plenty of questions over the news that Score Board, former official licensee of Coca-Cola filed for Chapter 11 reorganization bankruptcy in March (See "Quik Takes," Page 38). Regardless, Coca-Cola's popularity remains strong, and collectors looking for the "real thing" will search out and stash away some highly collectible cards right now. **MC**

Clearing up Coca-confusion

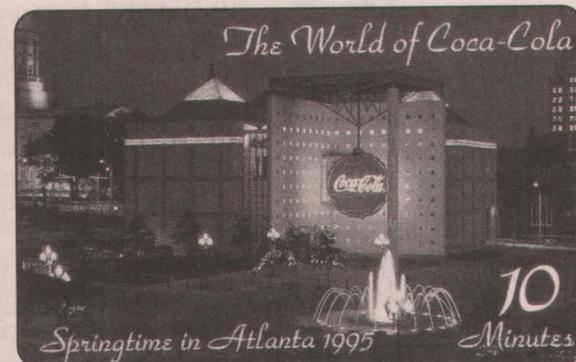

Although licensing between Coca-Cola The Score Board Inc. essentially terminated at the end of 1996, there is still a certain amount of confusion that remains about both the "World of Coca-Cola" series and the various retail Coca-Cola sets.

It should come as little surprise, then, that while you can find loads of other Coke-related items for sale at the World of Coca-Cola Museum in Atlanta, you no longer can find any phonecards there and likely won't in the future. The museum used to sell various of their own phonecards and even a small number of uncut "proof" sheets.

Coca-Cola employees who asked not to be identified say that they expect to get back into a national licensing of phonecards in the future - although, with the recent Score Board filing for bankruptcy protection, it's unlikely that any such licensing will be done with them.

While there has been a lack of national licensing of Coke-related

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items, there have been a number of local/regional issues of such cards – which proves the slogan that there's "Always Coca-Cola" for collectors to find.

First Edition

Let's go back to the very first WOCC edition, "Springtime in Atlanta," was released in April 1995. There were 2,500 live cards, which were available in special folders. In addition, there were 100 uncut proof sheets, each with 35 cards but no PINs. According to sources at Coca-Cola, the sheets were produced with the thought of giving them as gifts. Then, one of the First Edition sheets went up for auction at a San Francisco show in 1995 and sold for \$1,600.

There also were 100 First Edition samples, with about half going to the WOCC museum and the other half retained by Score Board. After that first issue, museum officials reportedly asked that no one other than the museum be provided with "sample" cards. Score Board officials insisted that they never sold samples or uncut sheets.

Second, Third Editions

Then came the Second Edition, "Red Hot Summer '95," 5,000 cards reading "The Hottest Spot in Atlanta." Production problems delayed its issue, so it came out simultaneously with the Third Edition, done for "America's First National Convention of Soda Jerks," June 1995.

Initially, Score Board produced 100 uncut sheets for the WOCC with Editions 2 and 3 combined on them. Individual cards of both sent to the museum had matte backs, rather than the glossy reverses the WOCC had ordered. The cards also had Score Board's "Classic" logo rather than the "Marketed by The Score Board" slogan in the lower right-hand corner. The museum sent these cards back to Score Board, except for 325 "Soda Jerk" cards for distribution to conventioners. When the proper glossy-back versions were done, they were numbered from 326 through 2,500.

In addition to those, there are an estimated 25-50 "prototype/sample" cards of each of the "Classic" cards in the marketplace. They can be recognized by the batch numbers that appear near the Coca-Cola logo in the lower left-hand, which they share with the corrected glossy-back samples. Those are "Batch # 888967" for the Second Edition cards and "Batch # 88970" for the Third Edition cards.

Another variation, according to WOCC employees, is that at least seven inactive "Red Hot Summer" glossy-backed cards had the word "sample" printed upside down. Score Board also reportedly printed 20 of each of the editions as test cards. These cards have a scratch-off covering over the PINs and the words "Sample/20" are printed to the right of the batch numbers.

Each of the 5,000 corrected "Red Hot Summer" and 2,500 corrected "Soda Jerk" cards sold directly by the WOCC were sold in special packaging, and all their subsequent issues also used special packaging.

Coca-Cola also ordered an additional 20,500 English versions of the "Red Hot Summer" card to be given to bottlers and the media, to Coke managers and for sale to consumers. It looks like a gray version of the blue WOCC card and there are text changes on the obverse. The "The World of Coca-Cola" slogan was eliminated and instead of saying "Hottest Spot in

Atlanta" at the bottom, it read "\$10 calling value."

There also was a Spanish-language version, with sources differing whether 1,500 or 2,000 were issued. There is at least one blank-backed proof sheet which has 28 English and two Spanish cards.

Yet another version was done for the 16th National Sports Convention, held in St. Louis in July 1995. More text changes were made, including the words "The 16th National Convention" replaces "The World of Coca-Cola" and "The Hottest Spot in St. Louis 1995" replaces the "Hottest Spot in Atlanta." The word "sample" replaces the 10-minute denomination. The card reverse featured a contest scratch-off to win prizes at the show, including a special \$2 version of the St. Louis card, 862 issued.

Both the "Red Hot Summer" and the "Soda Jerk" card also featured some sample cards without rounded corners. There also have been some four-card blocks on the market, as well as a block of 15 cards (five across and three deep) in the square-cornered style.

Fourth Edition

The fourth WOCC card was released in July 1995 for the Alfa Romeo Owners' Club's 37th National Convention. It features a old-time "Drive Refreshed/Host of the Highways" ad. In addition to 2,500 live cards, there were single sample cards, some of which read "Sample/20" near the bottom of the reverse. Also done were 100 limited-edition proof sheets, each with 35 sample cards. This edition saw the first issuance of certificates of authenticity by the WOCC.

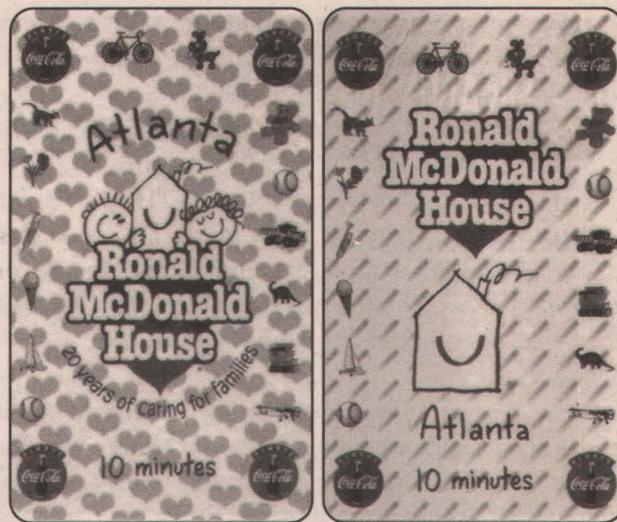
Fifth Edition

The fifth edition celebrated the WOCC's fifth anniversary, and also was issued in a quantity of 2,500. In addition to single sample cards imprinted "Sample/20," there were 50 uncut proof sheets, again with 35 images. The sheets also were sold with authenticity certificates. There was a special VIP version, 500 issued, with gold lettering and sequential numbering. An additional 25 uncut proof sheets each held 25 images.

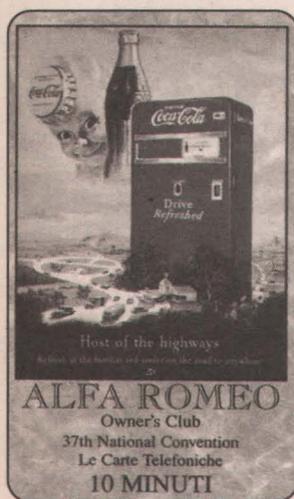
Sixth Edition

We've also learned that some sets of the last WOCC issue – the "Ronald McDonald House" set (*Moneycard Collector Catalog* ATT Pr98/99) – have been destroyed. There were a total of 2,500 sets produced. But after the calling time expired Dec. 31, 1996, some museum employees destroyed between 200 and 300 sets stored there. It was apparently not a situation that they decided it'd be the "right" thing to do rather than dumping them on the market, but one made out of ignorance of the cards' potential value. In any case, that should serve to make the remaining cards even more valuable!

BRAND NEWS

A cold beer, a nice pair of shoes and you're ready for a vacation. What does all that have to do with phonecards? They were all promotions that recently involved phonecards.

First up this month is a 10-minute card issued for Michigan Software Services Inc. This is a very low mintage card (only 100) issued with time by Sprint. It sports the IBM logo and was given out to perspective new clients of Michigan Software Services to help establish a rapport with new customers. The card was issued in December 1997 and most of them were dispersed.

Two Phonecard Express cards of note are now fairly difficult to obtain. The company fired up a 10,000-card promotion for Miller Lite. The 5-minute cards were distributed nationally during the Christmas and New Year's holidays.

If it's a nice pair of shoes you're after, customers who shopped at Macy's over the holidays found a 15-minute card inside boxes of Rockport shoes. A total of 8,500 cards were distributed throughout approximately 100 Macy's stores by Phonecard Express.

Gazelle Telecard took to the skies recently with a promotional card for Alaska Airlines. A total of 20,250 cards with 10 minutes of time were issued for customers who booked vacation packages through Alaska Airlines.

Each time a vacation package is booked to Alaska, California, Mexico and Disneyland, the customer will receive one of these cards. The card was issued in January and you may be able to find one by inquiring with your favorite dealer.

Communications Design Group plugged into a promotion with Remington to issue 300 30-minute cards. The cards were handed out to attendees who spent 10 minutes at Remington's booth during a recent trade show. The card was issued in December 1997 and very few made

it to dealers.

Capital Communications Group issued a good-looking card that is sure to spice up your collection. The 30-minute card features an array of spices and was one for Sysco's McCormick Spices brand.

Finally, we've got room this month to picture a couple of cards that were written up in the last two "Brand News" columns but due to a lack of room, we didn't get them pictured.

A Mexicana Airlines card by Caymen Resources was also featured in the March column. 500 of these cards in various denominations were issued. This card has found it's way in limited quantities to dealers. Check with one if you're interested.

Last but not least is an Exxon card from the April column which also was issued by CDG. Check with your favorite dealer for this one.

That's the scoop for this month. If you see any "Brand" related cards or card offers, we'd appreciate you letting us know.

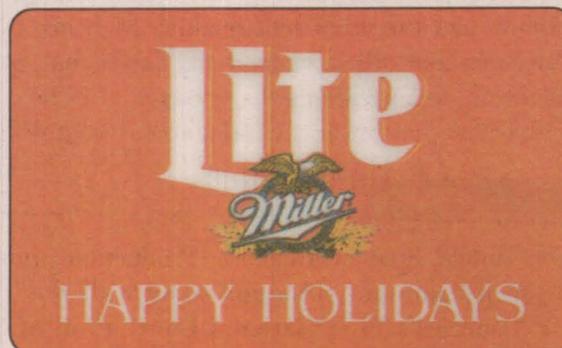

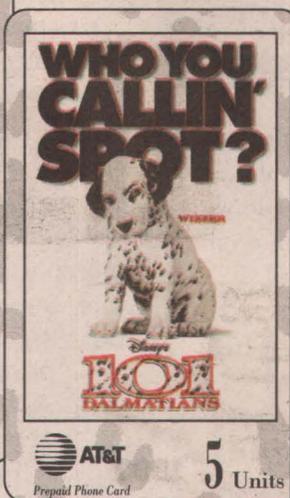
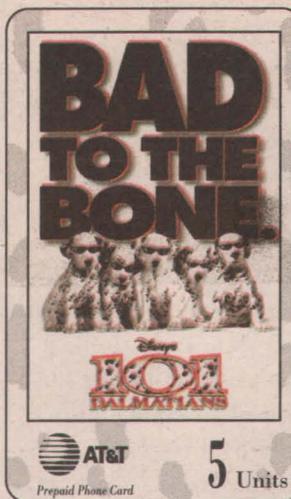
AMERICA'S MOST WANTED

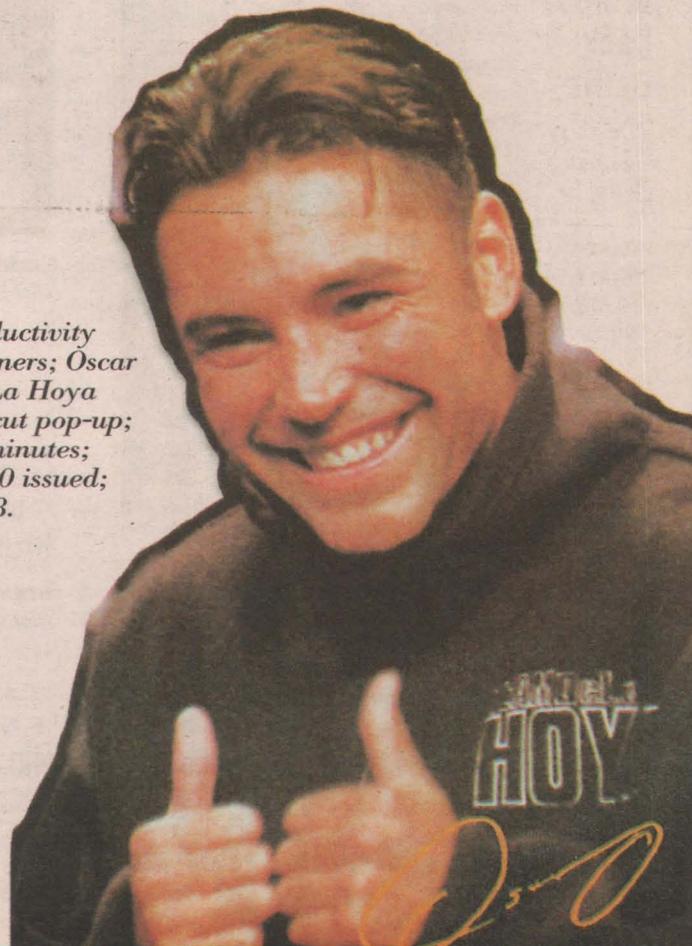

Telecard World '98 Dallas

Cards with a Wild West theme were much in evidence during March's Telecard World '98 Dallas.

There was a healthy herd of show cards in evidence, with images ranging from bucking broncos to cowhide. Not only did two issuers produce die-cut cards in the shape of Texas, there also were two puzzle sets, including a four-card set that formed a map of Texas. To keep the western theme alive, VoCall offered free chips and snacks at lunch time, accompanied by a guitar-playing, singing cowboy.

There was a tie for the top show card between Worldwide Digital's Texas die-cut and Continental Plastic's Texas die-cut set of five. Worldwide issued 500 5-minute cards, while Continental issued 100 five-card sets, with five different time carriers. Each card had 15 minutes of time. These cards were popular at the show. After the show card winners were announced, they sold out.

One of the most eye-catching was a lenticular-motion card featuring a cowboy on a bucking bronco. Five hundred 10-minute card were done by Creative Communications.

Some cards were distributed at the show, but were not showcards per se. GE had a nice \$5 card that was simple yet very colorful; Galaxy had a 10-minute phonocard with a race car and the driver autographed a few phonecards and some photos. LCI had a few different user cards available.

On the dark side of Dallas is the theme for CPDI's show card. It comes on a black carrier and talks

about Quake II, a 3-D game that is described as including brutal and exhilarating deathmatches incorporating well over 32 players. With 10 minutes of time this card is not for the faint of heart.

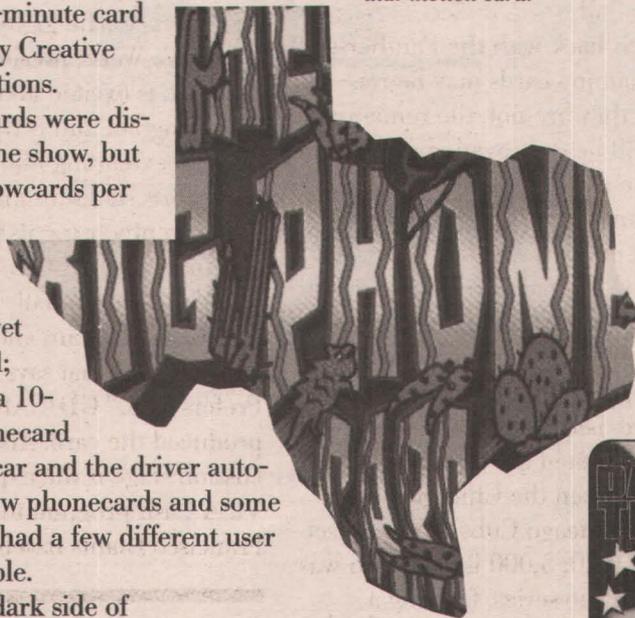
On the simple side was "Strike it Rich with Plastag in Dallas" is the theme of Plastag's card, which has blue background with various Texas themes in light gray and an oil well gushing oil in the foreground. It has 10 units of time provided by InComm.

Last but not least is the card issued by Equess. The front looks like a cowhide with the brand of Equess. The reverse also looks like cowhide. This card has 10 minutes of time.

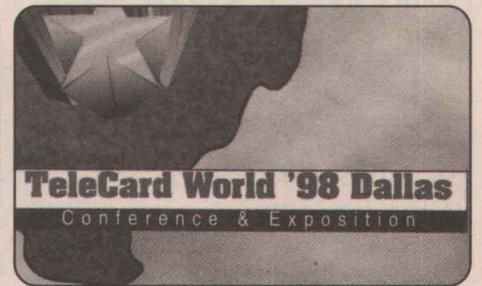

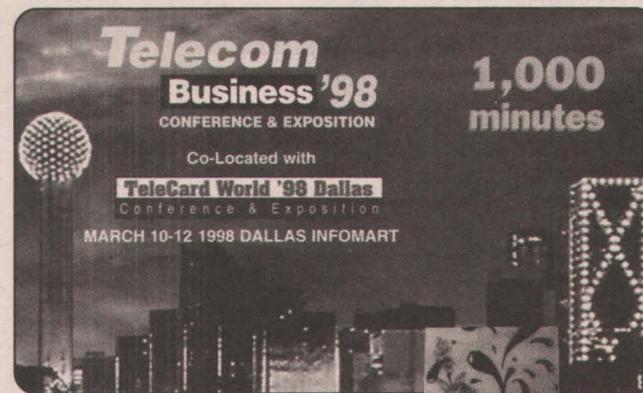

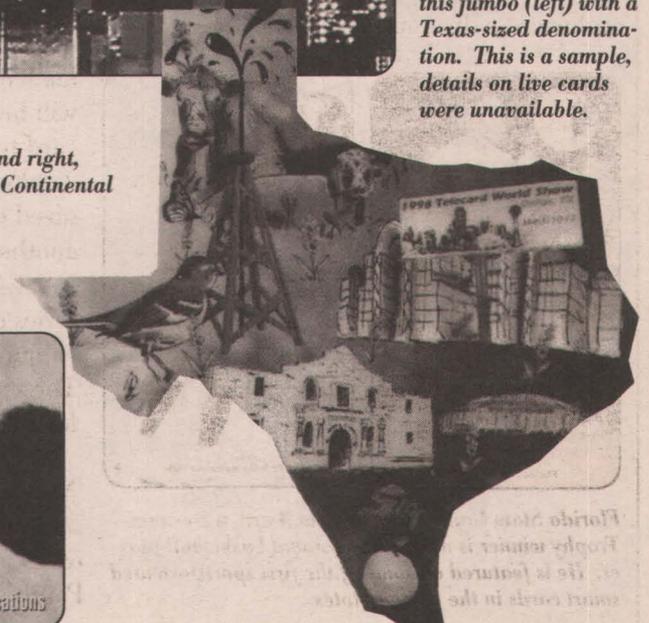

THE SCOOP ON CHIPS

Play Ball! Touchdown! Score! Start Your Engines! You can see them everywhere! Sports cards have made the smart card scene. It all started about five years ago when Florida State University introduced its prepaid magnetic stripe stored value card for use at its home football games.

The six-card set consisted of Coach Bobby Bowden; Chief Osceola and Renegade, the FSU mascots; Charlie Ward, the Heisman Award-winning quarterback who went on to play basketball with the New York Knicks; Corey Sawyer, now with the Cincinnati Bengals; Derrick Brooks, Tampa Bay Buccaneers; and Tamarick Vanover, Kansas City Chiefs.

The cards were preloaded with \$10 of stored value and were also good for \$5 worth of discounts on certain merchandise. The system, though profitable, was discontinued after the football season, even though cards for the basketball season had already been produced.

The NCAA ruled that images of current student athletes could not be printed on the cards. But the success of the program gained recognition for the FSU card program. Bill Norwood, executive director of the Card Application Center at Florida State University at the time, allowed visitors from schools and financial institutions from across the country to tour the

FSU campus and learn about the program. This was truly the incubator for the Visa Cash Olympics cards, the Jacksonville Jaguars football cards and the Carolina Panthers football program.

Much credit goes to Norwood and his staff for innovative card programs used by colleges and universities throughout North America. He is still active as vice president of business development for Cybermark, a supplier of integrated smart card systems.

Several thousand sets of the Florida State football cards were produced. An unknown quantity of the basketball set was produced but never distributed, although a few were given to vendors.

First Union Bank introduced its first professional sports smart card before the Olympics. First Union and the Jacksonville Jaguars inaugurated the 1995 NFL football season with the now famous, an eight-card Jaguar puzzle set. One card was issued for each home game. The complete set formed a beautiful picture of a Jaguar. The cards were non-reloadable cards produced by Schlumberger, according to Carolyn Van Pelt of First Union.

For this past NFL season, a set of 10 cards showing team players was offered to the fans. According to Van Pelt, these cards were very successful, especially with collectors. The issue was limited to 1,000 sets. Each card was preloaded with \$20. First Union will be continuing the smart card tradition next year.

First Union also recognized the emergence of another major league sports, NASCAR racing, with a series of cards put out in conjunction with Texaco. These cards will be the topic for a future column.

Not to be outdone, NationsBank issued its first series of non-Olympic smart cards for the Carolina Panthers. These "Fantastic

Plastic" cards were disposable cash cards supplied by Schlumberger.

The first series was issued for the 1996

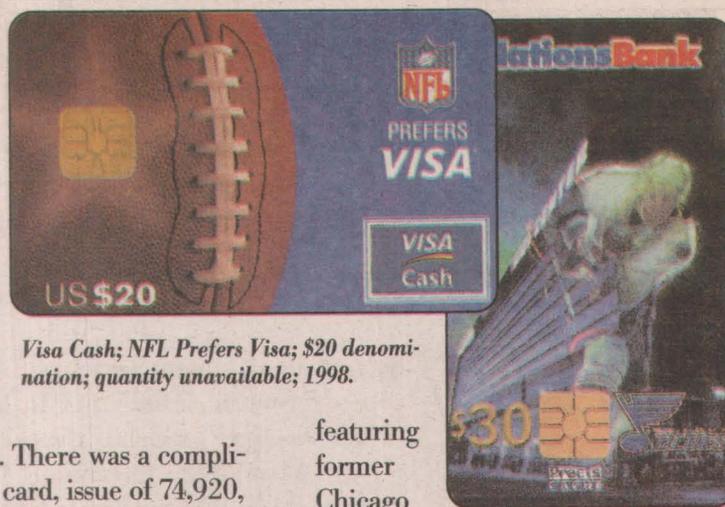
NFL season. There was a complimentary \$2 card, issue of 74,920, that was printed specifically for the first Panthers game at their new stadium. The second FANCash card was a \$20 card depicting the Panther helmet; 20,000 issued. Also issued was a four-card set featuring team mascot Sir Purr, Greg Kragen, Lamar Lathon and Kerry Collins. When placed together, the reverses form a view of the new stadium.

For the 1997 season, NationsBank issued seven FANCash cards. These included images of Coach Don Capers, a Bronze Panther, Sir Purr, and a four-card set of Panther Pro-Bowlers Wesley Walls, John Kasay, Kerry Collins and Sam Mills.

According to Richard Shaffner, senior vice president at NationsBank, there is an interesting tidbit for collectors. Kevin Greene was to be featured in the set; however, he held out and eventually signed with the San Francisco 49ers. About 300 Greene cards were circulated before the remainder was pulled. Now that Greene is back with the Panthers, the remaining cards may be reissued. If they are not, the remaining cards will be destroyed, making the card one of the most collectible sports smart card ever issued.

But major league cards are not limited to football. Precis Smart Card Systems, Oklahoma City, Okla., issued the first-ever smart card for a major league baseball team. It was a \$20 card, issue of 30,000, which commemorated the first interleague game between the Chicago White Sox and Chicago Cubs. A puzzle-set of three (\$20; 5,000 issued) also was issued for the series, forming a panoramic view of the ballpark.

For this season, the ballclub is issuing a series of "Legends" cards

featuring former Chicago White Sox players Nellie Fox, Minnie

Minosa, Bill Melton, Al Smith and Billie Pierce. Precis President Jim Lout sees a huge market for collectible sports smart cards, especially if the cards can be priced in the \$10 area.

Tangent Associates Inc. of Davie, Fla., teamed up with Precis to issue the first ever National Hockey League smart cards. The St. Louis Blues, who play their games at the Kiel Center, are featured on a puzzle set of four cards. Each card is valued at \$30; 5,000 of each card were issued last year. For this season, Tangent, Precis, and NationsBank teamed up to issue 5,000 "Spirit of Kiel Center" smart cards. The card is denominated at \$30 and the obverse shows both the NationsBank and Precis Cache logos.

Steve Weiss, president of Tangent, is excited about the smart card program and is looking forward to extending it to more of the 110 sports stadiums and arenas that are currently using its point of sale and inventory system.

Visa is continually expanding its Visa Cash program and has recently issued a card that says the "NFL Prefers Visa." GD/CARDTECH INC produced the card. Also in the discussion stage is the expansion of the VISA Cash program to the San Francisco Giants baseball stadium.

Moneycard firsts

Pioneering cards are good addition to any collection

Who's on first?" might be an old Abbott & Costello comedy routine. That's not to be confused with "What was first?"; which is the theme of this article.

What is the attraction? "First" cards are often plain, utilitarian cards with little to recommend them in image or quality. The answer lies, of course, in their historic value, and it is an area in which the hobby's youthfulness is an advantage. Moneycard collectors have a much better chance of acquiring pioneering examples than do their numismatic or philatelic counterparts.

Collecting firsts can be an interesting and sometimes frustrating endeavor, and should always be approached with a fair amount of skepticism - there is a lot of difference between "one of the first" and "the first" and there are folks who will agree with your perceptions, or try to sway you to theirs, especially if they have something to sell. With that warning issued, let's jump right in with some firsts as we see them.

Please note the "as we see them." If you know of any earlier moneycards, please let us know, and send us a copy of the card's front and reverse as well as any data. If there are any "first" categories that you think we should have mentioned, please tell us that as well.

Let's start at an obvious point: The first phonecard in the United States... Or is it obvious? Are we talking about the first test of a phonecard? The first public demonstration of a phonecard? The first phonecard circulated for retail use? What type of phonecard are we talking about?

Let's try to answer all of the above.

The Landis & Gyr Inteleexpo '85 card is often nominated as the first public use of a phonecard in the United States. The 120-unit optical card was issued for a show in Washington, D.C., in April 1985 to introduce Landis & Gyr technology to the United States. (Landis & Gyr, headquartered in

Switzerland, lay claim to inventing the first phonecards for pay-phones.)

But, as we reported in our October 1997 edition ("Making History," Page 44), the first test of a prepaid card in the United States might very well have been thermomagnetic cards tested by Crouzet, a French company. In September 1984, seven months before the Landis & Gyr debut, Crouzet tested its TTM (Thermo Tickets Magnetique) cards in the United States, probably in New York City.

The thin cardboard cards, 75 mm by 30 mm, were electrically charged and time was deducted through a high-frequency signal. The two types used in the test have been labeled "A" and "B" and are differentiated by the control numbers on the cards' reverses. The cards used in the U.S. are pale brown and white and can be distinguished by the words "Do not fold" on the obverse, next to the right of the word "Publiphone." German collector and dealer Bo de Vries estimates that only about two dozen single cards and sets of "A" and "B" cards exist.

Is that one "first" or two, or a first and a second? It all depends on how you slice the loaf.

Then there are the cards produced by CSS and by Phone Line USA, as noted by phonecard dealer Steve Eyer of Mount Zion, Ill.

Richard Sablon, founder of Cellular Security Systems (CSS) says that he started issuing prepaid remote-memory cards in Miami, Fla., in early 1985. Sablon notes that he linked his computer through an old office-type phone system. The system was set up with eight incoming lines and was programmed to automatically answer calls and route them to an outgoing WATS line. Sablon said he connected the phone system to a computer port and wrote a program to maintain and update personal identification numbers. "And thus, a new business was born," he says. Read more about it in this month's "Guest Commentary," Page 3.

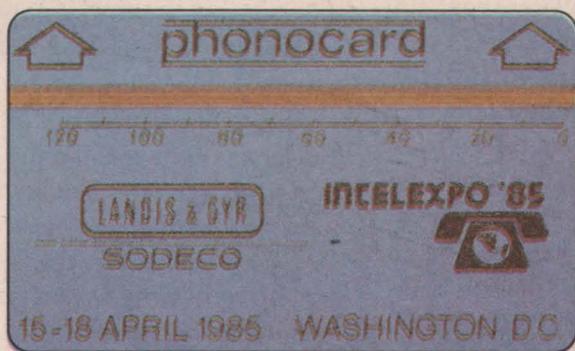
The original 1985 card was a light gray paper card with green ink. The obverse reads "CSS Communications Inc. Miami Florida" and "Long distance calling card." A plastic card issued "circa 1989" was gold with black ink and was used in Alamo Rent-a-Car locations. It says "CSS Communications" and "International Calling Card" on the front, with the image of a telephone cord and handset across the bottom of the card.

The first retail remote-memory card? Fast forward a few years to Hawaii. The first Phone Line USA cards were produced from offices in Hawaii in December 1989, giving them a solid claim to being the first U.S. remote-memory cards. Those early issues, in \$5-, \$8-, \$12- and 5-minute denominations, show black type across pictures of Diamond Head, Hawaii. There reportedly were a total of 3,000 cards made, although we don't have a breakdown on quantities.

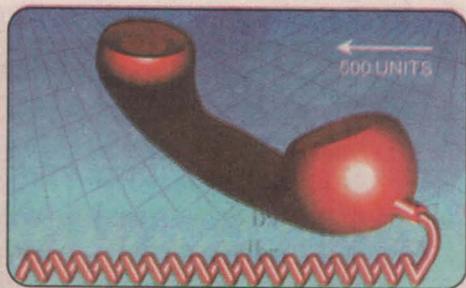
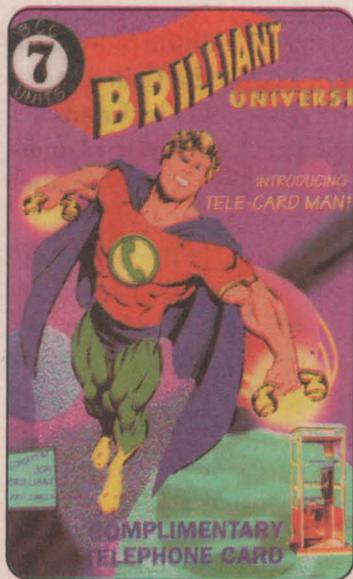
The first magnetic-stripe card issued in the United States might also have a Hawaiian connection. GTE Hawaii tested Japanese Tamura-manufactured cards in late 1989 and issued 90,000 10-unit Diamond Head-Waikiki cards in January 1990. Britain's GEC Plessey Telecommunications distributed magnetic-stripe cards - including one with a Coca-Cola logo - at U.S. trade shows starting in June 1987. The 1,000-unit cards command a high price.

While U S WEST was testing chip-based phonecards in 1992, International Telecom Inc.'s Telecom Alaska subsidiary issued its premiere series in September of that year. The four cards include \$3.50 denominations of Mount McKinley and a sled dog, each in a quantity of 3,000, and 75- and 150-unit versions of the Alaskan flag, each in a quantity of 2,684.

There are other forms of moneycards than prepaid phonecards, though. What is the first example of a chip-based stored-value card in the U.S.? The first cash card that we know of was the prototype issued for the MAC Annual

The first Visa Cash card was issued in May 1994 for a conference in Cancun. The first Canadian appearance of Visa Cash was by Toronto Dominion Bank in December 1995.

What about prepaid transit system cards? The Washington, D.C., Metropolitan Transit Authority has been issuing magneti-stripe cards since 1976. While most of those cards are high-quantity paper cards distinguished only by date or type of fare plan purchased, there have been designs celebrating the 1996 Olympics, national soccer championships, Inauguration Day and other events. See Page W-2 in the *Moneycard Collector Catalog* for more details.

The first phonecard issued by a multi-level marketing company? We think that credit belongs to AmeriVox, which issued 20 each of four \$20 denomination phonecards in January 1992.

What about the first Canadian phonecard? The first card on record to be tested in Canada were optical cards by Newfoundland Tel using Landis & Gyr technology. Issued in September 1988, they were 500- and 1,000-unit cards tested at the Goose Bay military base in Labrador.

Dealer Frank Ataw of Toronto notes, and we agree, that the first remote-memory card was Telecom Services International's February 1991 issue for the Miami Journalists Association. There were 1,000 of the 100-unit cards issued.

How about the first chip-based phonecard in Canada? Ataw nominated Bell Canada's La Puce chip card from August 1994. There were 100,000 of the \$10 denomination card produced. Magnetic-stripe? Bravo Technologies' April 1993 Vancouver Summit card featuring Boris Yeltsin and Bill Clinton. There were 70,000 cards issued with a denomination of \$10.50.

Then there are speciality cards, like the first jumbo, or the first die-cut or the first puzzle set.

For the title of first jumbo card in the United States, we nominate Brilliant Color Card's "Introducing Tele-Card Man," which was produced in September 1993. There were 100 7-unit cards issued. In Canada, how about Bell Canada's Hello! Phone Pass issued in July 1994. The 6-minute card, 2,500 issued, featured the Toronto Blue Jays baseball team.

The Blue Jays also figure in what Ataw nominates as Canada's first die-cut. The baseball-shaped card was issued in July 1995, also by Bell Canada. There were 26,000 6-minute cards. In the United States, we found round cards by North American Telephone issued in March 1994. There were 500 each of the five-minute cards featuring four Hawaii themes.

The first puzzle set in the United States that we have discovered was the five-card New York Puzzle Series. There were 1,000 puzzle sets produced in February 1994. Each card has 20 units of time. North of the border, a Bell Canada La Puce four-card set representing

the map of Quebec was issued in September 1995. Seven thousand sets were issued, each card with a \$10 denomination.

Collectors may wish to seek the first cards in their topical collections, too. The first McDonald's, Disney or Coca-Cola card are sure to be treasured additions to such a collection.

There are as many ways to determine moneycard firsts as there are collectors to dream them up. Not only the first Coca-Cola logo on a card, for instance, but how about the first Coca-Cola logo from each issuer? What about the first card representing your favorite sports franchise? New firsts are being created every day. Witness the recent AT&T Gemplus card (April 1998, "New Issues"). That is the first time an AT&T phonecard has been combined with a stored-value card. Mobil might not have been the first to introduce a prepaid gasoline card, but the combination MCI-Mobil phonecard-gas card, issued October 1997, is the first of its kind we have seen.

A good starting point to pursue your firsts is your *Moneycard Collector Catalog*. Each issuer's entries are listed chronologically, so it's easy to determine what came first. And it's easy to get a catalog, too, if you do not yet have one. Call 1- (800) 448-3611.

ISSUERS LAUNCHING PET PROJECTS. Pet owners should be breathing easier thanks to some innovative pet-tag phonecards on the market. Creative Communications and Personal Prepaid USA have unleashed "Zeke," is "jewelry quality" dog-tag phonecard. Two "Zeke" images are available, one called "Rex, King of the Mardi Gras" and the other called "Lions and Tigers and Bears." Plans call for several more images, including Zodiac signs.

The tags are made of nickel-silver alloy and come with 20 units of phone time. They are rechargeable at 19 cents a minute. The tags are a cooperative effort between Personal Prepaid USA of Roseland, N.J., and CCI of Houston, Texas, a division of EqualNet.

Not quite as fancy, but on the marketplace since last fall, with time by Cable & Wireless, is PCI Communications "Phone Home" Pet Locator Tags. The tags come in a variety of shapes and colors and have the look of a traditional pet tag. Each one features five minutes of phone time. That tag offers mail notification of renewal before it expires. It is good for one year from date of activation.

secured lender.

Score Board says that its net losses from through Dec. 31, 1996, totaled \$59.4 million. 1997 third quarter earnings were 4 cents a share. "We have a respected business franchise in the sports and entertainment marketplace and believe that it (the bankruptcy filing) is the best way to protect all constituencies' interests," the New Jersey-based company said in a news release.

SMART CARDS RISING, STUDY PREDICTS. A new study forecasts a smart card recharge market of \$26.5 billion in 2005, with chip-based cards predicted to grow from 12 percent of all smart cards issued today to 36 percent, or 2.9 billion units, in 2005. The Killen & Associates study predicts that stored-value payments will grow at a rate exceeding other payment methods.

"Stored value eventually will dominate the smart-card payments market although it is negligible today," said Michael Killen, president of the company, which has released the study "Stored Value: New Opportunities for Retail Banking and Telecard Providers." The study concludes that the sharp growth of stored-value applications and recharge requirements offer great opportunity to aggressive and forward-thinking telcos, retailers, hotels, casinos and others.

"Smart cards will be recharged by consumers almost anywhere and for all types of payment applications," states Killen. "Personal computers, public telephones, and cellular phones will soon have the faculty to act as ATM-like devices. Consumers will be able to make purchases over the Internet, access

accounts, make phone calls, pay for transportation, and perform many other functions, all with a single multi-purpose smart card." In contrast to the anonymity and disposability of virtually all phonecards and current SVCs, Killen says the multi-purpose card also contains programs that positively identify the user.

The recharge market includes both "remote memory" and "stored value" approaches to transferring value. In a remote-memory scenario common to most prepaid phonecards today, account value is computed and maintained in a central location. Stored-value chip cards actually hold and can compute value changes. This requires much greater storage capacity than a magnetic-stripe card can carry but which late-generation chip cards can quite easily provide.

Based in California, Killen & Associates is a market research and consulting firm which provides studies, seminars, and television programming for clients in the telecommunications, banking/financial services, and information technology industries.

GTS TO PRODUCE MONEYGRAM CARD. Global Telecommunication Solutions Inc. has entered into an exclusive three-year contract with MoneyGram Payment Systems Inc. for telecommunications services. The agreement grants GTS the exclusive right to produce a MoneyGram-branded phone card that MoneyGram will market and promote to its approximately 15,000 domestic agents for resale from their retail establishments.

Additionally, MoneyGram will purchase from GTS phone time to support the free phone call provided to certain money transfer senders as a feature of the MoneyGram service.

MoneyGram provides wire transfer, money order and other services through

22,000 worldwide agent locations, including convenience stores, supermarkets, drug stores and check cashers.

"This agreement provides GTS with the opportunity to sell phonecards from many of MoneyGram's 15,000 domestic agent locations," says GTS President Robert Bogin. "These retail locations have the potential to generate significantly more revenues than most other retail locations because it is our belief that a good percentage of MoneyGram's customers are high-volume phone card users."

Global Telecommunication Solutions Inc., headquartered in New York, is a facilities-based, global provider of prepaid phonecards that offer users reliable, convenient and cost-effective access to domestic and international telecommunications services.



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Cable & Wireless

Issuer succeeds with cards both foreign & domestic

For the sake of convenience, let's say there are just two Cable & Wireless companies. First is the parent operation, Cable & Wireless plc (UK). Based in London, it is an old, \$11 billion business. Next there is Cable & Wireless Inc. (USA). Based in Vienna, Va., it is a \$1 billion business, which started here in 1975.

Both companies issue phonecards. The USA subsidiary issues remote memory cards, while the UK company issues stored memory cards, almost exclusively. As you'll see later, the parent company owns many subsidiaries worldwide.

Cable & Wireless Inc. "provides a wide range of domestic and international public and private networking services exclusively to businesses." One of its business units is prepaid phonecards, which it refers to as prepaid calling cards. Cable & Wireless offers a total retail phonecard package to businesses, which can be as customized as the customer wants.

CWI issued its first USA phonecards in 1994. There have been several internal issues, some public cards, a number of publicity and showcards and a large quantity of promotional cards, for various businesses. All of them are highly collectible.

Most striking of all the CWI cards is the Global Digital Highway series, started in 1994 (*Moneycard Collector Catalog* numbers C&W 10 to 13). The set had an additional card, produced for the Los Angeles Telecard Expo in 1995 (MCC C&W 16). CWI has issued promotional cards for virtually every major phonecard show in the United States, such as New York, San Francisco, San Antonio and Chicago, as well as CardEx in Europe, and a show in Singapore. Some CWI cards include those available only to participants at USTA/ITA dinners.

CWI provides network services for other card producers. Look at the reverses of the phonecards in your collection. Chances are you'll find several that have Cable & Wireless on them. CWI has become quite aggressive in marketing its prepaid phonecard services. Their USA web site is www.cwi.nt. Most USA phonecard dealers have CWI phonecards for sale.

Now let's discuss Cable & Wireless plc (C&W). It is considered one of the top 200 international businesses by *Business Week* magazine. Check out www.cwplc.com for the HQ home page. The company dates back to the start of wire communications. The web site www.cwhistory.com will tell you all about this, except for, strangely enough, anything about phonecards.

1984 saw the first international C&W phonecards issued, in the Caribbean, on the island of St. Vincent. Since then, C&W has issued phonecards, through the appropriate subsidiary, in the Caribbean for the British Virgin Islands, Barbados, St. Kitts and Nevis, Turks and Caicos Islands, St. Lucia, Anguilla, Grenada, Dominica, Montserrat, Trinidad and Tobago, Cayman Islands, and Antigua and Barbuda. C&W also issued a few general Caribbean phonecards and collector packs, which were interchangeable among the various countries.

In the Atlantic, east of the United States, lies Bermuda, where C&W issues phonecards (www.cwbda.net.bm/ though there's no mention of phone-cards). In the South Atlantic, C&W has phonecards in the Falkland Islands, St. Helena, and Ascension Island. In the Pacific, C&W has provided phonecards for Tonga, while in the Indian Ocean, there are C&W phonecards on Diego Garcia, the Seychelles and the Maldives.

For most of these countries, the first phonecards were Autelca. They are easily identified by the wide magnetic stripe on the bottom of the front of the card. These cards were relatively plain and generic.

The second and subsequent issues were GPT. These are identified by a black reverse, with a large control number, in a gray box, at the top of the reverse. Control code varieties are fun to collect. For example, there are some early Cayman Island cards with the same design, but different control codes. There is typically a B in the upper right corner of GPT cards. In the middle of the reverse are three magnetic stripe segments, with additional segments at the lower left and lower right. The early cards had the "old" C&W logo, while the newer cards have the new logo, as you might have guessed.

Though the early cards were plain, most later cards feature incredible color photos depicting local flora, fauna, sights and people. These designs truly show how beautiful and colorful a phonecard can be. A few early C&W phonecards used Landis & Gyr optical cards. These included issues for Bermuda and the Seychelles. In the United States, Steve Eyer is one of the leading dealers in foreign phonecards. Be sure to ask for his catalogs that include C&W cards.

C&W owns the majority of Hong Kong Telecom (54 percent) and is a major owner of Bezeq, the Israeli telecom. They have the largest fleet of cable-laying ships in the world, and own one-twelfth of the world's undersea cable. In fact, I can write at least a paragraph about that part alone.

If you've noticed a bias toward the foreign C&W issues in this article, that's because phonecards don't get any more attractive, colorful and collectible than do the foreign issues of C&W. They should

be an inspiration to any company issuing phonecards. You can immediately spot a C&W phonecard by its all-over photo and predominately yellow lettering.

Remember the article on phonecard catalogs in the December 1997 issue of *Moneycard Collector* magazine? While all of the U.S. catalogs have great information on the U.S. CWI phonecards, two catalogs have some great information about the foreign C&W phonecards. The first (1994) edition of the Hiscocks & Garibaldi USA catalog told a lot about the Caribbean and Atlantic C&W phonecards. You can still obtain a copy from Steve Eyer or the Sears Phone Card Department for about \$15. As a bonus, this catalog covers early Mexican and Costa Rican phonecards.

By the time the second edition was published, there were so many more U.S. phonecard issuers that some even had to be left out. As you might guess, this also left no room at all for foreign C&W phonecards. By the time the *Moneycard Collector Catalog* was published, there were yet even more U.S. issuers.

A catalog which covers the rest of the early C&W phonecards is the 1990 Stanley Gibbons' *Guide Mondial de Cartes-Telephone*. As mentioned in the December 1997 issue of *Moneycard Collector*, the French language edition is available from Steve Eyer for \$40.

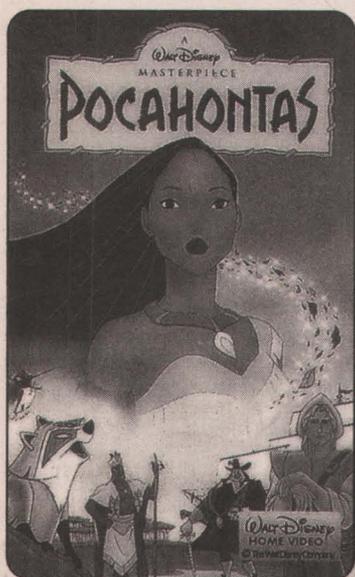
This catalog provides at least some information about virtually all worldwide phonecard issuing countries at the time. Don't let the catalog being in French throw you off, as you'll be able to figure out the basic information with little trouble.

So, in the United States, CWI is aggressively issuing phonecards and providing network services, meaning phone time, for other card producers. Foreign cards produced by the various C&W subsidiaries are among the most beautiful in the world. You probably already have several CWI phonecards in your collection. If you don't have any of the foreign C&W cards, now is the time to get some. **MC**
