It wasn't the official show card for the American Numismatic Association's annual convention that one, by USACard, was well received by collectors and visitors - but a couple of spelling errors made the GTS Royal Canadian Mint card much sought after. Where is "Colardo," anyhow?

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## WW TE NOEEY

Recent episodes have shown that the prepaid phonecard industry, as new and booming as it is, is still working on developing good habits.

One of the areas that need improvement is the practice of sending "sample" cards printed with PIN numbers. We received phonecards from two separate companies. In one case, the card set was stuck to a sheet of ordinary paper. Printed at the bottom of the sheet in small type was the advisory "These sample cards have not been activated."

The dangers of producing phonecards that look live but are not active are obvious. No matter how tightly controlled, having an inactive card that can be separated from the documentation that marks it as such is playing with fire.


In the other case, there was no warning at all. We had tested the card and received a recorded message that it had not been activated. When we questioned the issuer, we got the response. "Oh, those cards we sent you were just for the magazine." He explained that the card had been sent at the request of the customer, and normally that customer didn't want cards released. Nowhere on the card was a warning that it was a sample.

Sound familiar? HT Technologies Inc. - not involved in the instances cited above in their September letter response to the July story "Uncertain Utility" claimed that a card tested from Moneycard Collector's inventory was sent "as a sample only, for press release purposes and was not intended to have an active PIN."

Such sloppy practices overlook the fact that phonecards have highly desirable images, and collectors will find ways to get them. If a collector finds that the card is inactive, then everybody looks bad. The collector feels like he's been played for the fool; the dealer appears as he is selling shoddy goods; and the issuer looks like he's trying to pull a fast one.

In neither case mentioned did we detect any attempt to deceive. But being innocent and being perceived as innocent both are crucial to the industry. The steps to protect an issuer's integrity and the collector's perception are simple: Substitute the wording "sample" or "specimen" for the PIN, and print it on the card. If that's impossible, fasten a sticky non-removable label that proclaims "This is a sample" to the back of the card. Simple steps, yes, but ones that can avoid a lot of misunderstanding.

Moneycard Collector has taken another step forward, one that many readers wouldn't normally hear about, but one that they should notice: The magazine has been approved for a periodicals mailing rate, formerly called a second-class rate. Moneycard Collector had been mailing out copies third class, which has no required standard delivery time. The new status, according to Circulation Manager Terri Smith, should greatly improve delivery time and possibly improve the as-delivered condition of copies. We're thrilled about the change, because it helps us get the hobby's most exciting news to you in a more timely fashion. Kudos to Smith for her hard work.

In stating that the number of cards involved is likely to be far greater, we are emphasizing that batches of cards - which can number 100, as Mr. Tudor states - not single cards, are likely involved.

## Olympic experience mixed

Being familiar with stored-value cards by using them at the Jacksonville Jaguars games, I decided to purchase the First Union-Texaco set and try the VISA Cash cards out at the Olympic Games. One of the deciding factors was that the cards could be used at all Olympic venues for food and souvenirs. With the inflated prices, I thought I would easily spend the $\$ 180$ on the cards.

The venues I visited turned out to be a disappointment. In Fulton County Stadium, roughly six food vendors took the cards, requiring long walks to the concessions. None of the souvenir vendors took the card. At the mountain biking venue, it was a cash-only affair. I visited the Peachtree Center, which was advertised in the VISA Cash brochure and found three food vendors accepting the card. At Underground Atlanta, which was not advertised, several cart vendors did take the card.

The best locations were the fast-food partners such as Burger King and Chick-Fil-A. Burger King even had their own co-branded cards. Surprisingly, the worst place was the Texaco Star Mart where I bought the cards. I went back to it later in the day and the card reader had not been working all day. The clerk did not feel it was important enough to call anyone. The problem was corrected the next day.

I was surprised by the coverage range. I could use the cards up to 30 miles outside Atlanta. I experienced one card failure during the week. The cards do live up to their "easier than cash" claim as long as the clerks are trained to use them, but I feel that it is going to be up to merchants to embrace the card before the technology takes off.

## B\&B working hard

This is a reply to Mr. Daniel's letter about the 17th National Sports Collectors Convention (Page 5, October).
Please be aware that we sympathize with the problems of our customers in redeeming their prizes. Those problems were not of our making. We were unable to redeem Level V prizes because we did not receive the prizes from the manufacturer. We are currently redeeming them from our own inventory.

We ceased distributing Level III prizes when we learned that the 800 number printed on the cards was not working properly. We are continuing to request that the manufacturer replace those defective cards.
$B \& B$ never represented that redemption cards would be scanned; we do not know how or where that rumor was started. We carried out the prize selection in privacy to assure random selection, and fairness to all who were redeeming cards. We have suffered financially from the problems at the National, and are working hard to remedy the situation. We hope that our customers understand that with the 17 th National Coke product we also were the customer.

It remains our intention to meet all our commitments, and to continue to market a quality product to our customers.

At one time, there was one politics-related phonecard that was so important, it was used as a benchmark to help determine the state of the industry in the U.S. - the NYNEX $\$ 1$ card produced for the 1992 Democratic National Convention in New York.

Shortly before the convention started NYNEX conducted trials with Landis \& Gyr magnetic-striped "change cards" to be used in special phones. When they were asked to provide services for the Convention, they decided to create two special mag-stripe phonecards: 20,000 were done of a $\$ 1$ card to be given away to people involved with the convention; it featured a view of the NYC skyline. The other "Coin Replacement Card" was printed in a quantity of 12,000 , and pictured the head of the Statue of Liberty. Although it says " $\$ 5.25$," it sold in vending machines for $\$ 5$, with the additional 25 cents a free gift from NYNEX to try to encourage people to buy the card.

At that time, the majority of U.S. residents was unfamiliar with prepaid phonecards. Thus, many of the cards, especially the $\$ 1$ version, were thrown away or destroyed. The resultant rarity of the cards led to a massive increase in value for the remaining examples: around March 1994, the $\$ 1$ card had shot up to around $\$ 1,700$ and the Liberty Head card rose to about $\$ 320$. About a year ago, stashes of cards sud-

denly came into the market, quite possibly from foreign sources that had acquired the cards long ago, and the prices began falling. The $\$ 1$ card now retails for about $\$ 525$, and the $\$ 5.25$ goes for about $\$ 150$.

The cards have remained basically popular, with the potential for increased demand because of the 1996 presidential campaign, but wariness over the possibility of other large hoards has reduced their use as a reliable benchmark for the industry.

AT\&T also issued cards for the Democratic National Convention in 1992 with the "Teleticket" heading. The familiar Statue of Liberty image with an updated Democratic Convention message on the reverse was issued in 10 -, 25 - and 50 -unit denominations; 500 of each were produced. Also issued were cards bearing the slightlystylized name of the event on the front. There were approximately 1,200 done of the 10 -unit version, plus around 50025 -unit versions and 25050 -unit versions.

But this is a new presidential election year and so new cards are being released, each with stories behind them.

## Hop on GOP

The Republican Party held its tightly scripted "Inclusion-Fest" in San Diego from Aug. 12-15. For that event, Pacific Bell released a series of three cards
picturing four sights of the area, with the party's elephant symbol and the year in the center. They printed 25,000 each of the $\$ 10$ and $\$ 25$ version, and 15,000 of the $\$ 50$ version. There is a $\$ 5$ version, given to convention, city, host committee and Pacific Bell employees. There reportedly were only $300 \$ 5$ cards issued.

Pacific Bell Mobile Services also issued a smart card for the convention, trumpeting the roll-out of their PCS ("Personal Communication Services") system. The cards were for use in 500 handsets provided to campaign and convention officials. Pac Bell is calling the PCS system the "next generation of wireless technology." The chip-based cards were for use in handsets provided by Nokia and Motorola, both sporting stars-and-stripes designs, and an Ericsson handset bearing the image of a trumpeting GOP elephant.

AT\&T also issued 10- and 25-unit PrePaid Calls cards for the GOP convention. The 25 -unit cards included the wording "limited edition" on the obverse. Charles Cudlip of Hannibal Communications, who attended the convention, said that is first time he can recall such a label on an AT\&T issue.

A direct-mail letter was sent by the mayor of San Diego to a GOP-supplied list of various delegates and affiliated people. Captioned "So, What Kind Of CardCarrying Republican Are You?" the flier, with the Pac Bell logo mentions that a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the cards would help defray some of the costs of the Convention.

Cards also were available for sale by calling Pac Bell and via a vending machine at their convention booth. The cards were not given away as "gifts" to conventioneers. The flyer mentions that the cards "may not function from some foreign countries."

On the unofficial side, America Calling Card/ComTel Debit Technologies issued a card with a lighter touch for the GOP convention. The $\$ 10$ denomination card features a flag-waving elephant squashing a donkey. Of the 1,000 issued, 250 were given away to visiting politicians, delegates and the media with the balance for sale to the public.

Also weighing in just in time for the GOP convention was PhoneCardsUSA's $\$ 10$ phonecard. The card features a photo of the White House with the optimistic label "1997 Dole Residence." The San Diegobased company issued 1,000 numbered cards Aug. 1, and they reportedly were a hit with delegates and Republican supporters.

## Democratic process

For the official activities of the 1996 Democratic Convention in Chicago, local RBOC Ameritech installed equipment for what it considered to be "the most technology-intensive convention in history." There were eight varieties of prepaid telephone cards in Ameritech's stylized "Stars-from-the-AmericanFlag" design.

For "land" lines, Ameritech issued a total of 43,000 cards: 22,000 five-unit versions as giveaways in welcome bags presented to delegates and special guests, and 10,500 each of $\$ 10$ and $\$ 20$ denominations that were available at about 35 venues, including a vending machine at an Ameritech office, in kiosks at some major hotels and at the United Center convention hall. AT\&T, which issued two prepaid cards for the convention, held the contract for long-distance calls.

In conjunction with Brite Voice Systems, Ameritech issued 25,450 prepaid cards you could only get as part of a rental of cellular phone equipment. Ameritech planned for the possibility of up to 100 percent cellular usage at the '96 Democratic National Convention, up from an estimated $25-30$ percent at the '92 conventions. Cards were released in four denominations for advance payment of cellular phone service (quantities in parentheses) - \$30 $(16,600)$,

$\$ 60(5,300), \$ 90(1,850)$ and $\$ 120(1,800)$. Those versions had the word "cellular" added in red near the center of the design.

After the initial setup of an assigned code, there was no need to enter passwords or codes for each call, since the Brite system could then "read" which rented phone was being used for calls. A "regular" (non-DNC) \$120 card also was available for prepaid cellular use.

Ameritech also offered a special DNC Prepaid Card Collection Album. There were 1,500 produced, and, after being offered first to Ameritech employees with 300 for sale at the convention, the balance was distributed at cellular phone stores. The album had special slots for the six highest-denomination cards plus an exclusive $\$ 5$ jumbo. When the cards and jumbo are put in the album, they form a puzzle set of the "flying stars" flag design. The 5 -unit card had its own special folder.

At a face value of $\$ 337$, the issue certainly is one of the most expensive sets of U.S. cards ever initially sold as a single set. Unlike the Republican Convention cards, none of the DNC card proceeds go directly to the Democratic Party.

Employees at Ameritech's convention booths said they had been instructed to make no statements about how many phonecards had been sold.

AT\&T called their pair of cards "commemorative, discounted prepaid cards." Both were attached to carriers saying "Welcome to the 1996 Democratic National Convention." The 5 -unit card, selling for $\$ 3$, pictured the American flag and the AT\&T and Lucent Technologies
logos. The 25 -unit card, selling at $\$ 10$ had those logos, plus the Democratic National Convention logo and a view of the downtown Chicago skyline.

Carol Wydra, manager of local AT\&T events, said that, while no quantity was available, more than 1,000 phonecards were sold one day at an AT\&T booth, most of them the 25 -unit "skyline" card. She was surprised at the number of people who commented that they felt the cards would quickly rise in value as collectibles.

Convention delegate Paul E. Krizek - a rare bird to track down, since there were about 5,000 delegates and 15,000 media representatives - proclaimed "I love phonecards." Krizek, a legislative assistant to a Virginia congressman, said he was exposed to phonecards in England years ago when visiting his parents. He said he has kept his 1992 Democratic Convention NYNEX card in mint condition.

Also in the welcome bags given to delegates and the media, there was another telecard. Miller Lite provided an interactive card which allowed callers to reach their "party headquarters" plus relayed information about restaurants, bars, entertainment and events in the area.

Ameritech distributors Powell Associates and USA Card said they expected to receive some of the DNC cards. Interested collectors should contact those companies.

Strategic Telecom Systems Inc. produced four cards for 1996 Democratic National Committee. One of the 10 -unit cards features Clinton and Gore, the other three bore the words "Win in " 96 " with blue, red and blue, and flag backgrounds. There were 1,000 of each issued.

## Race for the presidency

The convention cards are just the end of the trail: In February 1996, a "Race for the Presidency" series of cards was produced by East/West Telecom. To encourage interest by young people in the election process, a poster contest was initiated for kids in the Boston area, promoted by

The winning poster design, called "Communication," was printed by Jericho, with time provided by AT\&T: 250 serially numbered cards with 5 minutes of time, plus 50 numbered cards reading "test" and 30 blank-back proofs.

East/West also issued a specific "Race For The Presidency" card, in 10 - and 100 -unit versions: the

front was the same for both, showing the name of the card with the "E Pluribus Unum" eagle design and a logo saying "Supported by AT\&T." The interactive, 100 -unit cards allowed callers direct connection to the offices of the Massachusetts governor, that state's U.S. senators and a congressman, and the White House. The total printing for the 100 -unit cards was 30 blankback "proofs," 50 cards numbered and labeled "test" and 100 regular versions. The 10 -unit versions, designed more for the collector's market, had 50 imprinted "Test," plus 1,000 standard versions, all serially numbered.

For the New Hampshire presidential primary in February, SmarTel distributed 1,000 interactive "flag" cards with 10 minutes of long-distance calling time. The cards only could be activated only by beating a Feb. 19 deadline for answering various questions age, sex, income bracket, political affiliation, and who you'd vote for in the Republican primary. Nearly a third of the recipients answered the questions within 24 hours after obtaining the card.

## Starting them young

Beginning in late July, Post Cereals, in conjunction with GTS, gave America's youth something huge to chew on: the release of more than 15 million interactive "voting cards" in boxes of Alpha Bits, Flintstones, Honeycomb and Golden Crisp cereal brands. The eight cards - two per brand of cereal - allow people to use the phone to call in and vote for their choice for president - after which they'd hear a recorded "Thank you" from their choice. One goal of the program was to get kids more interested in the political process.

Some White House aspirants can't be taken seriously. An example is seen in a series of two $\$ 6$ cards issued by ACMI this year. Both feature America's favorite cartoon cat, Garfield.

The first, issued in April with a quantity of 2,000 , featured Garfield holding onto a "USA" logo atop a field of a flag-colored map of the country. That was a subtle sign of what was to come. At the end of August, he could seen in a Nixon-esque "double-V-for-

Victory" pose as he eagerly begins his campaign of "Garfield in '96 For President." As his motto at the top of the card points out with frightening accuracy "You've Done Worse."

Also on the lighter side, in September 1994, ACMI issued one of their "Endangered Species" cards with a caricature of President Bill Clinton. It shows his birthday ("Issued $8 / 19 / 46^{\prime \prime}$ ). Two versions were done, using the same image but with a different quantity shown - the $\$ 3$ one reads "1992," and the $\$ 7$ one shows "1996."

Exposure to the political process causes the imagination to yearn for appropriate phonecards: One that pops to mind would commemorate politicians who take a stand one week, and then change position the next. A flip-flopping chameleon in front of the U.S. flag might be a fitting - though perhaps not politically correct - phonecard image.


BABY BELL NOTES

Last month we discussed prices and appreciation for the Ameritech phonecards. This month, we take a look at NYNEX.
This Baby Bell has issued three types of phonecards to the general public. The first was the 1991 Landis \& Gyr optical stored memory cards. They were in use for about three years. Magnetic cards were first issued to the public in 1994, while remote memory cards came out in 1995. NYNEX has also had several internal test, service, and trial cards. Since these weren't available to the public, with one exception, they won't be covered in this article.

In a nutshell, prices for NYNEX stored-value phonecards are either flat, or have generally dropped. One reason for this is that NYNEX stopped issuing the optical cards in 1994, and has issued almost no new magnetic phonecards during 1996. Without growth, meaning new cards, the interest in collecting older cards of a company tends to fall.

There was a lot of speculation in the early NYNEX cards, most of it said to be from German groups or individuals. A recurring phenomenon in phonecards is that virtually nobody in a country first issuing phonecards initially collects them, while collectors in other countries, who missed their own first issues, tend to invest heavily in the other country's new cards.

Any time a collector hears the word NYNEX, the first thought is usually the famous \$1 1992 Democratic National Convention complimentary card. (See "Politically Correct," Page 6). Each delegate to the convention received one of the cards in their materials. Most of the delegates probably had no idea what phonecards were. Thus, many of these phonecards more than likely got tossed into the trash.

Prices like $\$ 1,500$ or $\$ 1,700$ have been paid for this card - information that is bandied about by the print media. Moneycard Collector has determined that one card did change hands for $\$ 1,750$. Current price guides list this card at about $\$ 500$.

## Careful shopping

With careful shopping, you should expect to pay less. If you are selling one of these cards, dealers probably will quote you a buy price of around $\$ 200$. This is not a particularly difficult card to locate, assuming you want to pay the price. NYNEX produced 20,000 , so even if half to three-quarters of them were indeed lost forever, that still leaves a quantity similar to many other common Baby Bell phonecards that are selling for considerably less. Incidentally, getting the folder that this card came in will set you back an additional $\$ 50$ to $\$ 200$ ! Is a piece of cardboard worth that much?

A card that many people think is more attractive than the $\$ 1$ DNC card is the $\$ 5 \mathrm{DNC}$ card $-12,000$ were produced. Price lists and guides today have it val-
ued from \$150 to $\$ 250$. Skipping the folder for the $\$ 1$ card will save you just about enough to buy the $\$ 5$ card!

Two cards collectors like are the first $\$ 5$ card and the first $\$ 1$ compli-

Actually, all the $\$ 5$ Landis \& Gyr optical cards have an indicated value of $\$ 5.25$, as paying $\$ 5$ for the card gave the user a 25 -cent bonus. None of these cards was issued with a higher face value, though the system would have allowed it.

Current prices for public card No. 1, known as the New York Skyline, range from $\$ 85$ to $\$ 115$. If you want the folder, expect to pay an additional $\$ 5$ or so. The first $\$ 1$ complimentary card sells for $\$ 35$ to $\$ 50$.

Ellis Island was the theme for a set of four cards issued in 1993. Expect to pay from $\$ 35$ to $\$ 55$, with the price guides tending towards the lower amount.

Perhaps the most speculative set of L\&G cards is the "Wish You Were Here" postcard series of five cards. The location names were written in large hollow letters, with a single or collage of photos of landmarks and tourist attractions inside the letters. The NYNEX "WYWH" set captures the mood of these postcards perfectly, by displaying New York state sites. They also turn out to be the set that had the least number of cards sold to the public. Although 70,000 sets were produced, all but about 16,000 were destroyed when NYNEX made the move to the current magnetic cards. After those figures were announced, prices shot up to almost $\$ 100$ a set, though they have now fallen back to about $\$ 55$.

Cooperstown, one location featured in the series, is the site of the Baseball Hall of Fame. Baseball collectors absolutely love this card, and are often willing to pay up to $\$ 30$ for it alone. But buying just one card breaks up sets, while the other cards can be bought for the equivalent of face value, or less, if you buy the entire set.

The only other NYNEX L\&G optical card remarkable for its price is the $\$ 5$ Luge, issued to commemorate of the 1994 Olympic Winter Games in Lillehammer, Norway. NYNEX was the sponsor of the USA luge team, and will be again in the 1998 games in Nagano (spelled incorrectly on the reverse of these 25,000 cards), Japan. The $\$ 5$ Luge boasts the third lowest quantity of the optical cards. It's an Olympic card, and a sports card. It's also the last optical card produced. Yet the price remains a constant $\$ 20$ to $\$ 25$, because almost all 25,000 were sold. Sales and speculation were heavy, based on the reasons mentioned above.

NYNEX started selling magnetic cards in 1994. These cards have an all-over magnetic surface on the reverse, as do Japanese phonecards. In fact, these NYNEX cards are made in Japan. A single $\$ 20$ card was issued by NYNEX, as part of the four-card

Inaugural Series. All subsequent NYNEX magnetic cards have had denominations of $\$ 1, \$ 2, \$ 5$ or $\$ 10$. Every card includes the traditional 25 -cent bonus.

Interestingly, while both NYNEX and NTT (Japan) phonecards have holes punched in them to indicate remaining value, the Japanese holes count down from right to left; the NYNEX holes read from left to right.

A few magnetic cards are worth mentioning. Otherwise, virtually all magnetic cards are still available from NYNEX or its Collector Club. "Peace" was the topic of a late 1994 card. Several hundred were autographed by the artist. When they didn't sell as anticipated, the remainder were sent out to club members at face value. These cards currently retail for around $\$ 55$, which is quite a windfall for the club members. About the same is true for the 1995 autographed Peace card. What is surprising is that the unsigned 1994 Peace card was issued in the low quantity of 17,000 though the retail price is comparable to any other magnetic card. Does this mean there are less than 17,000 people collecting NYNEX magnetic cards? Incidentally, the autographed cards come from a specific block of serial numbers, in order to prevent forgeries.

## Surprising University cards

Another surprising situation involves the New York University pair of $\$ 5$ and $\$ 10$ cards. There were 10,000 sets produced, while there are about 25,000 students enrolled at the school, and there are plenty of yellow payphones on campus. Less than half the students could get a set, should they choose to collect them. On top of that, about 1,000 went to the collecting club members. Yet, the cards are still selling at just a few dollars over face value. Go figure.

Other magnetic cards of note include a customized photo phonecard issued at Telecard World East '95. For $\$ 5$, anyone could get a photo taken with the Radio City Music Hall Rockettes. The photo was then put on a $\$ 2$ NYNEX promotional phonecard, while the customer waited, so each is unique. So, why isn't each one selling for a $\$ 1,000$ or more? This makes no sense, based on what dealers are asking for cards issued in larger quantities, including some that never carried any phone time.

There was a mockup card made to be used in sales promotions. It featured the doughnut-and-coffee-cup design of the then-current Yellow Pages. No phone time was ever put on the 25 prototype cards, yet they now appear on pricelists and guides for more than $\$ 1,000$. Although the cards are listed as prototypes, that wasn't the intention of the card, according to a high-level NYNEX official. Nor will this design ever be issued as an actual phonecard. NYNEX printed about 30 business cards for Global Telecard Co., the first private-issue cards printed by NYNEX, on the same $\$ 2$ promotional cardstock as the TCWE '95 Rockettes/photo cards mentioned above. The business cards are priced at an estimated $\$ 2,000$ in one guide, while you might have trouble even giving away the
same phonecard with your photo on it.

There are a few remote memory cards that worth collecting, including one that was issued at the 1995
Telecard World show in New York City for the USTA (now ITA) dinner. Retail prices range from $\$ 160$ to $\$ 225$ for

Don't be confused by the listings for the two $\$ 16$ Brasher Doubloon cards, which feature the first gold coin minted in America. One is a normal size card, issued in January 1995, and intended for an internal trial only. The other $\$ 16$ card, which has a different design, is a jumbo, which was sold to the public about a year later. The coin was minted in 1787 - and it wasn't an accident that 1,787 were produced. They said "NYNEX TRIAL
CARD" on the reverse, and had a magnet-

Since these cards weren't supposed to be available to the public, early price estimates ran as high as $\$ 700$. Today, you should be able to get one for about $\$ 200$. While five times as many of the Brasher Doubloon trial cards were issued as the USTA cards, why isn't the USTA card priced higher? Perhaps because all of them ended up in collector or dealer hands. This, then, begs the question of why the Brasher Doubloon card isn't selling for more.

Another remote memory card of interest is the Vermont Governors' Conference card. Supposedly, you could only obtain this card if you attended the conference, or if you bought at least $\$ 400$ worth of other NYNEX remote memory cards. This tactic turned off many people, who stopped collecting remote memory cards once it became apparent they could never have a complete set, due to this missing card.

Collecting NYNEX phonecards can be both exciting and affordable. The Landis \& Gyr cards are among the first issued in the United States, and are historically significant, as well as colorful and attractive. The new magnetic cards are worth getting, as most are still available at, or slightly above, face value. Most collectors can afford to obtain a complete set of NYNEX public cards. Save up your money, and buy the most expensive cards first. Then fill in the blanks. There are many back-of-the-book cards you can collect, including test, trial, service and maintenance cards. You can expect to pay a considerable amount for those, though you shouldn't have too much trouble finding them for sale.

Unidentified flying objects have haunted the skies since mankind lived in caves, but UFOs did not become a fixture of pop culture until the middle of the 20th century.

These days, thanks to aggressive marketing, UFOs appear from Hollywood to the boardrooms of Madison Avenue. Extra-terrestrials (ETs) are as much a part of the popular culture of the '90s as were Mickey Mouse and Bugs Bunny in earlier times. "They" are everywhere - in the movies, on the tube, even on the backs of cereal boxes.

And on phone cards.
Stephen Saunders' Public Access Telephone Co, in Phoenix, Ariz., has produced a series of 12 cards, each featuring a famous UFO photograph from such remote places as Fyffe, Ala., and Takamatsu City, Japan.

On the back of each card are the usual set of dialing instructions, along with a caption about the photo location. These, by the way, are "real" snapshots - not movie stills from "The Day The Earth Stood Still." Some of them have doggedly defied analysis.

On June 24, 1947, the American obsession with

UFOs began when pilot Kenneth Arnold observed nine, disc-shaped objects moving in tight formation at fantastic speeds over Mount Rainier in Washington. Arnold was struck by the erratic movements of the objects, which he likened to that of saucers skipping along the surface of a lake - hence the term "flying saucers."

Thereafter, UFOs sightings popped up throughout the U.S. and around the world.

Military officials debunked the idea of unidentified flying objects, though some people believed, and continue to do so, that bureaucrats knew more about the saucers than they were revealing, and that what they knew was scaring the daylights out of them. As media debates raged on, people began to watch the skies some of them hopefully, others fearful that an invasion was under way.

What they saw, and still see, forms the background for a whole new chapter of American folklore: UFOs, real or not, were here to stay.

Saunders dubbed his rather disturbing series of phone cards "The Visitors."
"I was inspired by the fervor over the anniversary of the moon landing," he explained, "so I came up with the text: ' 22 years before man

landed on the moon, a UFO crashed in Roswell, N.M.' To my knowledge, this is the first series of its kind produced anywhere in the U.S., though I have seen cards on UFOs that were made in Japan. But that's not too surprising since Japan creates nearly 25,000 phone cards a day."

Saunders ultimately intends to produce 2,500 cards, though to date there are only 1,000 in existence. Phone time on each card is 15 minutes. The cards were printed by the Barrington Plastics Co. in New Jersey.

While Saunders is knowledgeable about UFOs, he consulted with experts before producing the cards. He worked extensively with retired Air Force Col. Wendell Stevens, who maintains an extensive library on the phenomenon. It was from this library that the photos were obtained.
"Colonel Stevens has an actual photo of a 'gray,'" said Saunders. "Grays" are the big-eyed, hairless, diminutive beings most often associated with UFO abductions. "He won't release the photo though, because he's not certain if it's a hoax."

Stevens, the author of 17 books on UFOs, has worked with the phenomenon for decades, and was featured on one of the earliest saucer documentaries, "UFOs are Real."

Saunders takes UFOs quite seriously, and has tentative plans for future phone card projects on similar subject matter. He may, for example, issue a series on the so-called "Midway" sightings near Roswell, N.M., the alleged crash site of an alien spacecraft back in the late '40s.

The Midway UFOs appear as long, self-luminous "flying rods," and no one who has seen them, including experts in the fields of meteorology and astronomy has been able to satisfactorily explain them. The rods are frequently observed in the area, and their aerial escapades have been captured on more than 700 hours of videotape, according to Saunders.

Another possible project may be a series on actual ET photos, which like the aforementioned "gray" photograph possessed by Stevens, are exceedingly hard to verify. "Some of these beings have been appearing in mystical experiences for centuries," said Saunders, whose attitude toward ETs may be best described as ambivalent. "Are they physical or paraphysical? Good or evil? Who knows?" Who indeed?

## UFONcards' timing: eerie coincidence, or...

Six phonecards by a Colorado-based company should help keep the interest in alien visitors alive.
While "The Visitors" phonecard series by Stephen Saunders (see related story) shows actual photographs of purported flying saucers, Stephen Hume's "UFONcard" series deals with more exotic themes. "For that really long distance phone call," Hume says of his unworldly cards. Hume says he and computer illustrator Joe Jones, who helped to create the images, both have a lifelong fascination with UFOs.

The original three-card set, a two-card puzzle set of flying saucers whizzing around the Moon and a third card of saucers surrounding Earth, each feature a purple-skinned alien with glittering eyes. A total of 1,311 cards, each with eight units of time, were made for the UFO and New Age Expo and Enigma Con '96 events in Denver, Palm Springs and Phoenix.

Perhaps the spookier cards are Hume's "Roswell 50th Anniversary Set," a three-card puzzle set with a mintage of 1,947 , the number commemorating next year's 50 th anniversary of an alleged UFO crash in Roswell, N.M. That set is due out in November or December.

Hume said the day after he completed the final image in a series of markings that run down the right side of the Roswell set, scientists announced they had discovered evidence of life on Mars Hume's final image is a geographic feature called "the face on Mars." The card fronts show alien heads, flying saucers in outer space, and an image of a crashed spacecraft. The reverse of the puzzle set features a full-color map of the Roswell crash site and a brief history.

The voice prompts on the cards inform callers that Earthlings, too, are space travelers - "As we ride our blue stone, hurtling toward Vega at 12.5 miles per second ..."

It is no coincidence that Hume's company is BlueStone Productions.

Two versions of this card were issued with a total print run of 100,000 . However, 500 individually numbered collectors cards were issued and these are rather difficult to find.

CTN also issued 7,100

## QUIK TAKES

AMERIVOX LAUNCHES CANAVOX AmeriVox and its parent company, World Telecom Group, recently announced three major service developments designed to enhance its market position in prepaid cards and expand overall service capabilities. The company has launched its first foreign subsidiary, CanaVox. Patterned after AmeriVox and marked with a new $\$ 30$ (U.S.) phonecard, the Canadian company will be selling cards denominated in Canadian currency. Depending on the amount of time purchased, perminute rates range from 29.9 to 39.9 cents plus applicable taxes.

A second $\$ 30$ (U.S.) phonecard marks the launch of AmeriVox International, a sophisticated, computerized, international call-back service that replaces the TransWorld service. TransWorld was the first universal prepaid phonecard, allowing users to call from any touch-tone phone to any other phone in the world (see Moneycard Collector, October 1994).

AmeriVox provided Moneycard Collector CanaVox and International call-back cards with scratch-off PINs, noting on a separate piece of paper that the cards were "inactive samples" - the International card because an error was made in printing the PINs. Nine digits were printed instead of the correct 13 . There were 5,000 of the nine-digit cards printed but only a "handful" were distributed privately, AmeriVox said. The correct 13-digit cards were being printed as of Moneycard Collector's deadline.

The third new service, though not marked with a card, may turn out to be the most significant: the entry of World Telecom Group into the oneplus long distance market. Available only in the U.S., the new service features several options, each with its own target market and rate structure:

- "AmeriPlus Premier" aimed at the residential market; 23.9 cents/minute (peak); 8.9 cents/minute (off-peak);
- "Personal 800 Service" designed for families wishing to call home from out of state at a lower flat-rate cost (18.9 cents/minute);
- "AmeriPlus Simple" for business and daytime callers ( 13.9 cents/ minutes, 24 hours a day) with the option of 800 service;
- and "AmeriPlus World," WTG's entry into the one-plus international market.
Company officials expect that AmeriVox representatives will crossmerchandise phonecards with the one-plus products to help drive sales of both.

]YNAMIC TECHNOLOGIES HAS SPARKLING START Dynamic Technologies Inc., an outgrowth of the Promotional Phonecards dealership, celebrated its inaugural kick-off in midAugust.

The new multi-level marketing company, led by President Diamond Zaferis and vice presidents Frank Villacampa, Tony Longworth and Stephen Saunders, is reaching out strongly to the public with collecting in mind. Representatives sell many different products, including collectible, limited edition prepaid phonecards as well as user cards. The company is also
 moving toward selling telecommunications services such as prepaid cellular communication and one plus.

The launch, well attended by representatives and customers, featured several speakers, including various company officials, local Phoenix radio personality Gil Tyree, who is a true phonecard believer and Moneycard Collector Cataloguer Tori Stone, who spoke about the joys of collecting.

The company, headquartered in Mesa, Ariz., also will support the Diamond Phone Club. For a yearly membership fee, club members who collect can receive cards for a discounted price, a newsletter and phonecards made exclusively for the club.

B\&B, SCORE BOARD HEADED TO COURT? A dispute over Coke and McDonald's phonecards to be given away as prizes at the 17 th National Sports Collectors Convention has sparked a legal dispute between B\&B Fone Collector Cards and Promotions and The Score Board Inc. Each side alleges breach of contract and other wrongdoing. It is not yet apparent how the final outcome will affect collectors. A court case may, however, be averted. "We're very much interested in reaching an amicable settlement for the benefit of collectors," said James Robinson, Score Board vice president of marketing.

## AMERICA'S MOST UANTED

Another month of interesting card-collecting activity to report. It appears that some new issues released and targeted directly for collector circles may have overloaded collectors' interest. New issuers with reasonable rates per minute and forthright information concerning card mintages have proven to be the winners as of late. Additionally, corporate or promotional cards seem to be increasing not only in number but in appeal as well. As you may have noticed, cards with relatively low mintages (such as Dennis the Menace) have remained on AMW for several months. Collectors have given chase to this and other low mintage cards since they were issued, while many dealers have put the cards in "cold storage," waiting for the cards to appreciate. Cards trade hands again and again, and based on demand, will eventually end up in your pocket. Keep informed, buy early and don't forget about historical issues as you chase the exciting new ones!


1USACARD'S PINK PANTHER OLYMPICS. Our hurdling feline is a winner this month. With the secret scratch-off, it tops our America's Most Wanted. Scratch off to see if you have the normal 10 -unit $(1,500$ issued), the much scarcer 12-unit ( 400 issued), or the rare 15-unit ( 96 issued) card! The fourth in the popular Pink Panther series.

 USACARD'S CRACKER JACK. Another secret scratch-off. The Cracker Jack card combines the scratch-off fascination with a truly outstanding and colorful design. Another winner for USACard, who seem to be all-hits-and-nomisses with their latest issues.

3DELTACOM'S 15-MINUTE ICEBREAKERS. This neat corporate card is set apart by its special glittery background. Many collectors of only U.S. cards may be unaware that these "special effects" have been around for years on Japanese cards, so if you collect cards with special effects, check out some!


4KARS/TELENOVA CRAYOLA STORE A second-time visitor to America's Most Wanted, the 1,500 -mintage card, now dubbed "Crayola II," celebrated the grand opening of an Easton, Pa., Crayola store. This card will be a good one due to the current demand for Cable \& Wireless products, especially from Strategic Telecommunications Systems (STS), a growing multi-level marketing company that does much of its business with C\&NV.


GRAPEVINE TELECARDS/AT\&T OLYMPIC GAMES.
The set of four 10 -minute cards carries the official Olympic logos (some of the few cards that do) and has a variety of subjects on the front, including Izzy, the mascot of the Games. The reverse carries the AT\&T logo, although technically a private card like No. 4 above. The issue price is high, but the licensing wasn't cheap! Mintage is only


Phonecard Express created these cards as a giveaway in Blockbuster Stores for purchasing the movie. The card, attached to a cardboard carrier with the same image, is a truly great deal: no scratch-off with ten minutes of time. So, the card will be a mint card again after the expiration date. Frontier carries the time; 5,000 cards were issued.


## 7USACARD \& CATHY FOR BREAST CANCER CURE SET OF FOUR. The inau-

 gural visit to the Top Ten by Cathy, the eternally single career girl with a penchant for womanly insights. The telephone theme rings through on this set, which was designed by artist/cartoonist Cathy Guisewite, a phonecard collector herself. Logos announce the financial support of the series for the National Race for the Cure, a Breast Cancer Research


Foundation. Mintage on this is open, an unusual situation for USACard, who seem to know what they are doing; this is the third USACard production on this month's AMW.

0ITS KENTUCKY DERBY SET OF FOUR. Promoted at a bargain rate to collectors after the Derby, this set contains 100 minutes of time. The set is very attractive and the subject world famous. An added bonus: the fully licensed cards
 are affordable, proving that extraordinary licensing fees need not be passed on to the collector or user.
 AT\&T DENNIS THE MENACE/DAIRY QUEEN. One of the first low mintage AT\&T cards certainly caused excitement! AT\&T will no doubt produce many other low mintage cards in the future, since many large telcos have come to realize the benefits of serving the private/promotional sector.

# VENERABLE VISA 

# A visit with the "granddaddy" of VISA Cash

The Olympic Games are over! The new gold of the collectible VISA Cash cards has been carried home to countries around the world! Olympic participants and visitors alike used this new "electronic cash" to buy everything from hamburgers and sodas to movie tickets and train rides. 1996 will not only be remembered for the Atlanta Olympics, but also for the first major introduction of stored value cards in the Americas. Pictures and descriptions of those beautiful cards have abounded for months. It's time to take a look at the demonstration SVCs used by VISA before the official launch of VISA Cash - the "granddaddy" cards that helped to make all the rest possible.

It was at the VISA International Annual Conference of May 1994, held in Cancun, Mexico, that Edmund P. Jensen, president and CEO of VISA International, announced that VISA would introduce a stored value card. At the time, the launch of VISA Cash at the 1996 Olympics was not even considered.

The theme of the conference
was "One World - One Currency - VISA." Each SVC issued to the attendees carried this theme, along with a depiction of the pyramid at Chichen-Itza. The card was issued in a companion envelope that contained an explanation of the SVC and instructions on how to use the card at the vending machines in the exhibit area. A snack vending machine, dispensing all types of VISA Olympic memorabilia, a beverage vending machine dispensing canned soda, and a newspaper dispenser vending copies of the "VISA News" were all equipped with SVC controllers.

To show the complete concept, paper bills were also included in the attendee card packet. These one unit bills were used to add value to the SVC, allowing attendees to purchase additional items. The whole introduction was such a success that the Visa Latin American region decided to issue cards at its annual member meeting, followed by the United States region deciding to do a similar promotion. At the Cancun conference, 1,500 cards were issued, individually numbered through 1,500 . The Cancun card was featured on the cover of several magazines and in brochures for Smart Card conferences.

The VISA Latin American Region Annual Conference, held in Naples, Fla., was less than a month later, but a new card design was developed. Again the theme was "One World - One Currency - VISA." but this time the message was also printed in Spanish: "Un Mundo - Una Moneda - VISA" and in Portuguese: "Um Mundo - Uma Moeda VISA." The card was enclosed in an attractive coordinated folder explaining the Stored Value concept and instructions on how to use the card. This time, only the VISA

numbered 001 through 400 , that were issued at the conference, held in the summer of 1994 in Santa Barbara, Calif.

The same theme was again used at the 1994 ABA Bankcard Conference, held in September 1994. VISA memorabilia was dispensed from vending machines. In addition, Olympic gold medalists Bonnie Blair and Pablo Morales were on hand for photo opportunities and to draw the winner of the VISA "Olympics Games Sweepstakes," a free

Olympic memorabilia vending machine was equipped with a stored value controller, and again, it was a big success. Only 500 cards were issued at the conference, numbered 0001 through 0500.

But there is an interesting sidelight to these cards. A first set of 500 cards, numbered 001 through 500 , was inadvertently sent by ground transportation, rather than overnight courier. When it could not be guaranteed that the cards would arrive on time, a second set of 500 cards - those with the four-digit serial number - were produced and transported by overnight courier before the attendees arrived. But the three-digit numbered cards did not go to waste. They were used at a subsequent VISA meeting in Colombia, South America, where a live SVC demonstration was desired. This time attendees placed the card in a SVC controller attached directly to an electronic cash register. Another big success!

For the United States Region VISA Member Executive Conference a new theme was introduced, "The Future is VISA Investing in Tomorrow's Technology Today." This theme was carried over to the graphics of the Conference SVC and its accompanying folder. As in previous conference literature, the potential for using stored value cards to tap into the estimated $\$ 8$ trillion spent annually using cash for purchases under $\$ 10$ was touted. The cards were used to purchase VISA Olympic memorabilia and soft drinks. Attendees received one of the 400 cards,

all-expense paid trip for two to the Atlanta Olympics. Whereas the reverse side of the U.S. Executive Conference card read "An exhibit of innovative products and applications for the VISA Member Executive Conference 1994 - Four hundred cards issued," the reverse of the ABA Conference Card read "An exhibit of innovative products and applications for the 1994 Bankeard Conference, Chicago, Ill. - Two thousand cards issued." These latter cards were not numbered as the previous conference cards had been.

A similar approach was used at the 1994 Retail Delivery Systems Conference, Phoenix, Ariz., in the fall of that year. The card had the identical front graphics; the reverse side was similar to the previous two cards, with the exception that the new conference name and location was used. The accompanying brochure was also similar. Another VISA Olympics Sweepstakes was held. This time the gold medalists on hand were Pablo Morales and Diann RoffeSteinrotter. For this conference, 2,500 cards were issued, and they were sequentially numbered.

All the pre-VISA Cash activity culminated in March 1995, when the official announcement was made worldwide that VISA would have SVCs available for the Olympic Games in Atlanta, with NationsBank, First Union National Bank, and Wachovia Bank designated as the issuing banks. The announcement was made almost simultaneously at press conferences around the world - New York, Toronto, Mexico City, London and Sydney, Australia. The reloadable memory card would be used for the last time. Future SVCs, the official VISA Cash cards, would use disposable memory cards and reloadable microprocessor cards.

This press conference card, seen around the world in newspapers, magazines and on television, would resemble the first VISA Cash cards that were issued for the VISA Corporate pilot and the

## Early VISA cards hard to find

A$s$ awareness and usage spread about VISA Cash, the interest in the moneycards will grow, and the same holds true for the demonstration cards that are the ancestors of the current program.
"There's definitely some interest in the early cards," says David Phillips of Powell Associates in New York. "If people knew about them, I could develop an interest in them."

Phillips says he has seen a few of the early cards, and views them as very saleable. Remarking on the rumored price for one of the VISA Cancun conference cards (see related story), he says " $\$ 1,300$ sounds reasonable."

Scott Shapiro of KARS Unlimited says $\$ 1,300$ sounds high, but "if the card is rare and desirable, it's not an unbelievable price."

Finding the pre-VISA Cash cards is the trick, Shapiro says, and as the cards get more exposure, some of them might come out of hiding.

Australian SVC program. The difference was that there was no face value on the card. Also, the graphics on the back would differ. The reverse side of the press conference card reads "The VISA Stored Value Card makes the most common purchases the most convenient, fast, accurate and easy to use. It's A Lifestyle Product that keeps pace with you." It was interesting that the front of the card still said "VISA Stored Value" and not "VISA Cash" - the board of directors had not yet approved that name for the SVC product. Even the first card used at the corporate pilot still used the old terminology. By the time that the banks began to issue corporate pilot cards, the VISA Cash name was officially sanctioned.

Is there gold in these early pre-VISA Cash cards? Only time will tell. Rumor has it that one of the Cancun cards was sold for $\$ 1,300$. With the limited number of cards in circulation around the world, it is difficult to say how many can get into the hands of collectors. But as awareness of these cards increases, the desirability of these cards by the serious collector also will increase. After all, these are the "granddaddy" cards of all subsequent SVCs issued in the Americas. These are where it all started! MC

## New Japanese cards fight fraud

For many years now, Japan has not been issuing high face value prepaid cards due to the high level of fraudulent use of NTT cards.

Reuse of cards, especially those with the single punch (one call only), reached a peak and is now being curbed.
Pictured, top, is an NTT card which shows signs of multiple use, and, right, an NTT card with stripes carved in the obverse to prevent reuse.

KDD, the local long-distance carrier, now has issued numerous chip cards that can be used in its distinctive orange boxes. ITJ is another carrier that also recently introduced chip cards.

Meanwhile there is evidence that
 remote memory cards are being made available to users. Shown are recent cards from Telebell and from KDD.

While AT\&T has not issued cards in Japan, it has commissioned numerous commemorative pictorial NTT cards to publicize its services.

## McDonald's series unveiled

The Score Board Inc.'s new collectible phonecard packs might have enough variety of McDonald's images to satisfy even the most avid collector. Being promoted as the first-ever all-McDonald's phonecard foil packs, 499 cases of the phonecards - three cards to the pack, 18 packs to the box, 10 boxes to the case - were released in July. Also in July, $\$ 2$ and $\$ 5$ phonecards were released as part of the McDonald's collectible card series.
Bulk lots of phonecards also were distributed to two dealers, Promotional Phonecards and Sports Talk Etc., but Score Board's Brian Cahill said he did not know how many cards were in the bulk lots.


The phonecard pack series includes:

- $\$ 1,000$ foil-stamped phonecards, five cards in a series, numbered to nine;
- $\$ 25$ die-cut phonecards, featuring food items, three cards in a series, numbered to 856 ;
- $\$ 10$ phonecards, 10 cards in a series, spotlighting the McDonald's racing team, numbered to 1,420 ;
- $\$ 5$ acetate phonecards, 10 in a series, numbered to 2,500 ;
- $\$ 2$ Golden Arches foil-stamped phonecards, 50 in a series, numbered to 426.

The sequentially numbered phonecards released in both the collectible phonecard packs and the collectible card series include a $\$ 2$ denomination, 50 in a series, sequentially numbered to 6,110 and a $\$ 5$ denomination, 10 in a series, sequentially numbered to 5,510 .

In addition, proof cards and test cards also were released in the phonecard packs. 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It was a tale of two cards at the 105th anniversary convention of the American Numismatic Association in Denver.

The show's official phonecard, produced by USACard, made a big splash, but it was the other card that is likely to make waves in collectors' circles. That card, issued by GTS on behalf of the Royal Canadian Mint, has a pair of spelling errors on the obverse, and was sparking a lot of interest in phonecard circles within a week after the August show.

The show is the big event every year for collectors and dealers of coins and related monies, and attracts attendees from all over the world. While rare coins and currency are the main attractions, a growing number of numismatists have discovered phonecards in recent years. That coin collectors are noticing phonecards was in evidence at the Denver show USACard produced 1,000 of the 10 unit show cards, and demand was so heavy that the Association sold out.

The Royal Canadian Mint card was used to promote the Canadian $\$ 2$ bimetallic Polar Bear coin, pictured on the card. But two spelling errors on the card caused it to be withdrawn shortly after the beginning of the convention. "Colorado" became "Colardo" and "Numismatic" was spelled
"Numisimatic." There were 500 cards made, but the net issue was 102 , with the remainder now destroyed. Of those, at least one-third went overseas, so the available U.S. supply is about 50 pieces. Dealer Steve Eyer reported seeing one of the error cards sold at the show for \$50. David Phillips of Powell Associates says the cards probably can

command \$75 to $\$ 100$.

The official show card depicts the Walking Liberty design - seen on the $\$ 1$ denomination silver bullion coin and on the 1916-47 U.S. half dollar - in motion coming out the

"We sold numerous memberships by offering a choice of the $\$ 5$ phonecard or a $\$ 12$ Redbook catalog. Most everybody took the phonecard. It was beautiful!" said Rudy Bahr, the ANA's membership director.

Alexander Suppes, a visiting German dealer who handles both coins and phonecards also was impressed: "They are going to want these in Germany. The collectors, they know the ANA and they like good art ... very low mintage for such a card."

USACard CEO Robert Mish credits company president Klaus Degler with the design of the ANA issue. Degler and Mish design all the USACard house issues as well as many of the private phonecards, with special attention to the official issues for coin shows. That attention makes sense, since both own coin companies as well.

Mish observed that coin and paper money collectors have taken a liking to phonecards, perhaps even more so than have participants of other hobbies. In part, this is because numismatists see phonecards as another form of money. "Numismatists do not call them just cards - their term is 'telenumia.' "

For collectors who could not attend the ANA Convention, a small number of cards was reserved for USACard affiliate dealers. Readers may ask their favorite supplier or call USACard at (303) 777-3034 for referral to a distributor.
